HOUSE BILL NO. 97

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3-3-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 ESTABLISH JUNE 19 (JUNETEENTH INDEPENDENCE DAY) AS A LEGAL 3 HOLIDAY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 3-3-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows: [JU1]

3-3-7. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) 7 of this section, the following are declared to be legal holidays, 8 viz: the first day of January (New Year's Day); the third Monday 9 of January (Robert E. Lee's birthday and Dr. Martin Luther King, 10 Jr.'s birthday); the third Monday of February (Washington's 11 birthday); the last Monday of April (Confederate Memorial Day); 12 the last Monday of May (National Memorial Day and Jefferson Davis' 13 birthday); the nineteenth day of June (Juneteenth Independence 14 <u>Day</u>); the fourth day of July (Independence Day); the first Monday 15 of September (Labor Day); the eleventh day of November (Armistice 16 or Veterans' Day); the day fixed by proclamation by the Governor 17 of Mississippi as a day of Thanksgiving, which shall be fixed to 18 correspond to the date proclaimed by the President of the United 19 States (Thanksgiving Day); and the twenty-fifth day of December 20 (Christmas Day). In the event any holiday hereinbefore declared 21

(2) In lieu of any one (1) legal holiday provided for in
subsection (1) of this section, with the exception of the third
Monday in January (Robert E. Lee's and Martin Luther King, Jr.'s
birthday), the governing authorities of any municipality or county
may declare, by order spread upon its minutes, Mardi Gras Day or
any one (1) other day during the year, to be a legal holiday.

30 (3) August 16 is declared to be Elvis Aron Presley Day in
31 recognition and appreciation of Elvis Aron Presley's many
32 contributions, international recognition and the rich legacy left
33 to us by Elvis Aron Presley. This day shall be a day of
34 recognition and observation and shall not be recognized as a legal
35 holiday.

(4) May 8 is declared to be Hernando de Soto Day in 36 37 recognition, observation and commemoration of Hernando de Soto, who led the first and most imposing expedition ever made by 38 Europeans into the wilds of North America and the State of 39 Mississippi, and in further recognition of the Spanish explorer's 40 one hundred eighty-seven-day journey from the Tombigbee River 41 42 basin on our state's eastern boundary, westward to the place of discovery of the Mississippi River on May 8, 1541. This day shall 43 44 be a day of commemoration, recognition and observation of Hernando de Soto and European exploration and shall not be recognized as a 45 legal holiday. 46

(5) Insofar as possible, Armistice Day shall be observed by appropriate exercises in all the public schools in the State of Mississippi at the eleventh hour in the morning of the eleventh day of the eleventh month of the year.
