AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-17-8, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
 REQUIRE AT LEAST ONE IN-SERVICE STAFF DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP FOR
 TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS TO BE DEDICATED TO SENSITIVITY
 TRAINING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-17-8, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

37-17-8. (1) The State Board of Education, through the 8 Commission on School Accreditation, shall establish criteria for 9 comprehensive in-service staff development plans. These criteria 10 shall: (a) include, but not be limited to, formula and guidelines 11 for allocating available state funds for in-service training to 12 13 local school districts; (b) require that a portion of the plans be devoted exclusively for the purpose of providing staff development 14 training for beginning teachers within that local school district 15 and for no other purpose; * * * (c) require that a portion of the 16 school district's in-service training for administrators and 17 teachers be dedicated to the application and utilization of 18 various disciplinary techniques; and (d) require that at least one 19 20 (1) of the school district's in-service staff development 21 workshops for administrators and teachers be dedicated to 22 sensitivity training in order to prepare such persons to function

H. B. No. 162 00\HR40\R147 PAGE 1 23 <u>effectively in a culturally diverse school environment</u>. The board 24 shall each year make recommendations to the Legislature concerning 25 the amount of funds which shall be appropriated for this purpose.

(2) Beginning with the 1998-1999 school year, school 26 districts shall not be required to submit staff development plans 27 28 to the Commission on School Accreditation for approval. However, any school district accredited at Level 1 or Level 2 shall 29 include, as a part of any required corrective action plan, 30 provisions to address staff development in accordance with State 31 Board of Education requirements. All school districts, unless 32 specifically exempt from this section, must maintain on file staff 33 development plans as required under this section. The plan shall 34 35 have been prepared by a district committee appointed by the 36 district superintendent and consisting of teachers,

administrators, school board members, and lay people, and it shallhave been approved by the district superintendent.

39 (3) In order to insure that teachers are not overburdened 40 with paperwork and written reports, local school districts and 41 the State Board of Education shall take such steps as may be 42 necessary to further the reduction of paperwork requirements on 43 teachers.

(4) If any school district meets Level 4 or 5 accreditation
standards, the State Board of Education, in its discretion, may
exempt such school district from the provisions of this section.
SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2000.

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
