HOUSE BILL NO. 224

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A STATE-ASSISTED LOCAL ROAD CONSTRUCTION 1 AND MAINTENANCE PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FINANCIAL 2 ASSISTANCE TO COUNTIES AND MUNICIPALITIES IN THE CONSTRUCTION, 3 RECONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF HIGHWAYS, ROADS AND STREETS THAT 4 ARE NOT INCLUDED ON THE STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM OR THE STATE AID ROAD 5 SYSTEM; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM SHALL BE ADMINISTERED BY THE 6 OFFICE OF STATE AID ROAD CONSTRUCTION; TO REQUIRE COUNTIES TO 7 8 PROVIDE EQUAL MATCHING COUNTY FUNDS IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE MONIES FROM THE SPECIAL FUND; TO LIMIT THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT 9 THAT COUNTIES AND CITIES MAY RECEIVE FROM THE SPECIAL FUND; AND 10 11 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 SECTION 1. (1) There is established a state-assisted local 13 road construction and maintenance program to be administered by 14 the Office of State Aid Road Construction for the purpose of 15 providing financial assistance to counties and municipalities in 16 the construction, reconstruction, overlaying, repair and 17 maintenance of highways, roads and streets that are not included 18 on the state highway system or on the state aid road system. 19 20 (2) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to be designated as the "State-assisted Local Road Construction and 21 Maintenance Fund." The State Fiscal Officer shall transfer the 22 sum of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) from the State General 23 Fund to the special fund each fiscal year during fiscal years 24 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2005. The transfer for each fiscal 25

year shall be made in four (4) equal quarterly payments, with the 26 first payment in each fiscal year to be made on July 1. Such 27 monies as are deposited into the fund under the provisions of this 28 29 section may be allocated and distributed, upon legislative appropriation, to counties in accordance with the provisions of 30 31 this act. Unexpended amounts remaining in the special fund at the 32 end of a fiscal year shall not lapse to the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited 33 to the credit of the fund. 34

Monies in the State-assisted Local Road Construction and 35 (3) Maintenance Fund shall be allocated and distributed to counties by 36 the Office of State Aid Road Construction upon requisition of the 37 38 State Aid Engineer. In order to be eligible to receive monies 39 from the special fund, the board of supervisors of a county must file application with the Office of State Aid Road Construction, 40 41 on forms approved by the State Aid Engineer, and agree to match an equal amount of county monies with the amount of monies 42 distributed to it from the special fund. No county is eligible to 43 receive more monies from the State-assisted Local Road 44 Construction and Maintenance Fund than the amount of county monies 45 that it agrees to match; and no county may receive from the 46 State-assisted Local Road Construction and Maintenance Fund during 47 48 the period from July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2005, an amount that exceeds, in the aggregate, an amount equal to the avails of a two 49 (2) mill ad valorem tax levy on all taxable property in that 50 county based on the 1999 assessed valuation of the county. 51

52 (4) Each county that receives monies from the State-assisted 53 Local Road Construction and Maintenance Fund, shall establish a 54 special fund in the county treasury; and all monies received by 55 the county from the State-assisted Local Road Construction and 56 Maintenance Fund, along with all county monies that the county

57 agreed to provide as match money, shall be deposited in the special fund of the county. Monies in the county special fund may 58 not be expended for any purpose except for expenses related to the 59 construction, reconstruction, overlaying, repair and maintenance 60 of highways, roads and streets within the county or within a 61 municipality of the county that are not included on the state 62 highway system or on the state aid road system. 63 The State Department of Audit shall have authority and responsibility to 64 make annual audits and investigations of all funds deposited to 65 66 and expended from such special fund of the county.

(5) Of the monies received by a county from the State-assisted Local Road Construction and Maintenance Fund, not less than twenty-five percent (25%) must be expended by the board of supervisors on roads, streets and highways within the corporate limits of municipalities in the county that have a population of less than twenty-five thousand (25,000) according to the latest federal decennial census.

74 (6) The governing authorities of any municipality having a population of twenty-five thousand (25,000) or more, according to 75 76 the latest federal decennial census, upon filing an application with the board of supervisors of the county, may receive out of 77 monies received by the county from the State-assisted Local Road 78 79 Construction and Maintenance Fund, an amount equal to the amount 80 that the governing authorities of the municipality agree to match 81 with municipal monies; however, no such municipality may receive more than an amount equivalent to the avails of a two (2) mill ad 82 valorem tax levy on all taxable property in the municipality based 83 84 on the 1999 assessed valuation of the municipality, and no county

85 is required to distribute from the monies it receives from the State-assisted Local Road Construction and Maintenance Fund more 86 87 than ten percent (10%) of such monies to all such municipalities 88 in the aggregate. Each such municipality that receives monies from the county shall establish a special fund in the municipal 89 treasury; and all such monies received from the county from the 90 State-assisted Local Road Construction and Maintenance Fund, along 91 with all municipal monies that the municipality agreed to provide 92 as match money, shall be deposited in the special fund of the 93 94 municipality. Monies in the municipal special fund may not be 95 expended for any purpose except for expenses related to the 96 construction, reconstruction, overlaying, repair and maintenance of highways, roads and streets within the municipality that are 97 98 not included on the state highway system or on the state aid road The State Department of Audit shall have authority and 99 system. responsibility to make annual audits and investigations of all 100 101 funds deposited to and expended from such special fund of the 102 municipality.

If any monies remain in the State-assisted Local Road 103 (7) Construction and Maintenance Fund on July 1, 2005, then the monies 104 remaining in the fund may be allocated and distributed by the 105 106 Office of State Aid Road Construction to counties upon the same basis as such monies were authorized to be allocated and 107 108 distributed to counties before July 1, 2005; however, a county 109 must agree to match an equal amount of county monies with the amount of monies distributed to it from the special fund and no 110 county may receive an amount that exceeds an amount equivalent to 111 the avails of a one (1) mill ad valorem tax levy on all taxable 112

113 property in the county based on the assessed valuation of the 114 county for the year 2004.

(8) If any monies remain in the State-assisted Local Road 115 Construction and Maintenance Fund on July 1, 2008, then the 116 117 State-assisted Local Road Construction and Maintenance Fund shall 118 cease to exist and the State Fiscal Officer shall transfer the monies remaining in the fund to the Local System Bridge 119 Replacement and Rehabilitation Fund created in Section 65-37-13 120 for expenditure in the same manner as other monies in that fund 121 122 may be expended.

123 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 124 and after July 1, 2000.
