- 2 AUTHORIZE THE SCHOOL BOARD OF ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT TO DESIGNATE A
- 3 PERSONNEL SUPERVISOR OR ANOTHER PRINCIPAL EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL
- 4 DISTRICT TO MAKE OR ACCEPT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF
- 5 NONINSTRUCTIONAL EMPLOYEES AND TO TRANSMIT APPROVED
- 6 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BOARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 37-9-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 37-9-17. On or before April 1 of each year, the principal of
- 11 each school shall recommend to the superintendent of the school
- 12 district the licensed employees or noninstructional employees to
- 13 be employed for the school involved except those licensed
- 14 employees or noninstructional employees who have been previously
- 15 employed and who have a contract valid for the ensuing scholastic
- 16 year. If such recommendations meet with the approval of the
- 17 superintendent, the superintendent shall recommend the employment
- 18 of such licensed employees or noninstructional employees to the
- 19 school board, and, unless good reason to the contrary exists, the
- 20 board shall elect the employees so recommended. If, for any
- 21 reason, the school board shall decline to elect any employee so
- 22 recommended, additional recommendations for the places to be
- 23 filled shall be made by the principal to the superintendent and

- 24 then by the superintendent to the school board as provided above.
- 25 The school board of any school district shall be authorized to
- 26 designate a personnel supervisor or another principal employed by
- 27 the school district to recommend to the superintendent licensed
- 28 employees or noninstructional employees; however, this
- 29 authorization shall be restricted to no more than two (2)
- 30 positions for each employment period for each school in the school
- 31 district. Any noninstructional employee employed upon the
- 32 <u>recommendation of a personnel supervisor or another principal</u>
- 33 employed by the school district must have been employed by the
- 34 school district at the time the superintendent takes office; a
- 35 <u>noninstructional employee employed under this authorization may</u>
- 36 not be paid compensation in excess of the statewide average
- 37 <u>compensation for such noninstructional position with comparable</u>
- 38 <u>experience</u>, as established by the State Department of Education.
- 39 The school board of any school district shall be authorized to
- 40 designate a personnel supervisor or another principal employed by
- 41 the school district to accept the recommendations of principals or
- 42 their designees for licensed employees or noninstructional
- 43 employees and to transmit approved recommendations to the board;
- 44 however, this authorization shall be restricted to no more than
- 45 two (2) positions for each employment period for each school in
- 46 the school district.
- When the licensed employees have been elected as provided in
- 48 the preceding paragraph, the superintendent of the district shall
- 49 enter into a contract with such persons in the manner provided in
- 50 this chapter.
- If, at the commencement of the scholastic year, any licensed
- 52 employee shall present to the superintendent a license of a higher
- 53 grade than that specified in such individual's contract, such
- 54 individual may, if funds are available from minimum education

- 55 program funds of the district, or from district funds, be paid
- 56 from such funds the amount to which such higher grade license
- 57 would have entitled the individual, had the license been held at
- 58 the time the contract was executed.
- 59 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 60 and after its passage.
