HOUSE BILL NO. 260 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 73-65-1 THROUGH 73-65-17, 1 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH ESTABLISHES THE PROFESSIONAL ART THERAPISTS ADVISORY COUNCIL AND PRESCRIBES ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; 2 3 TO AMEND SECTION 73-65-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE 4 5 DATE OF REPEAL ON THE PROFESSIONAL ART THERAPISTS ADVISORY COUNCIL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 73-65-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 reenacted as follows: 9 73-65-1. As used in this chapter, unless the context 10 11 otherwise requires: "Board" means the State Board of Health; 12 (a) 13 (b) "Certified professional art therapist" means a person who has completed a master's or doctoral degree program in 14 art therapy, or an equivalent course of study, from an accredited 15 educational institution and who is certified by the board, or who 16 received registration from the American Art Therapy Association 17 18 (ATR) before 1980; (c) "Certificate holder" means a certified professional 19 art therapist certified under the provisions of this chapter; 20 21 (d) "Accredited institution" means a university or college accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency 22 of institutions of higher education, or an institution or clinical 23 program approved by the American Art Therapy Association, Inc. 24 SECTION 2. Section 73-65-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 25 26 reenacted as follows: 73-65-3. (1) There is created the Professional Art 27 Therapists Advisory Council. The purpose of the council is to 2.8

29 advise the State Board of Health on matters relating to the 30 administration and interpretation of the provisions of this chapter. The council shall consist of three (3) members who are 31 professional art therapists certified pursuant to Section 73-65-7 32 33 and who have engaged in art therapy practice for at least five (5) 34 years and two (2) members shall be family members of consumers of art therapy services. All council members shall be citizens of 35 the United States and residents of Mississippi. The initial 36 37 council members who are not family members of consumers shall meet requirements for certification and be certified within one (1) 38 year after July 1, 1998. Beginning July 1, 1999, each council 39 member who is not a family member of a consumer shall be certified 40 41 as an art therapist before appointment and shall be actively engaged in the practicing or teaching of art therapy. The initial 42 council members shall be appointed by the board for the following 43 44 terms: one (1) member shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year; one (1) member shall be appointed for a term of two (2) 45 years; two (2) members shall be appointed for terms of three (3) 46 years; and one (1) member shall be appointed for a term of four 47 48 (4) years. After the expiration of the initial terms, all subsequent members of the council shall be appointed by the board 49 50 for terms of four (4) years.

51 (2) Members of the council shall receive no compensation or 52 per diem for their service on the council, but may receive 53 reimbursement for travel expenses incurred in attending council 54 meetings, as provided in Section 25-3-41.

55 (3) The council shall elect annually from its membership a chairman and any other officers as necessary to carry out its 56 The council shall meet at least two (2) times each year. 57 duties. 58 Additional meetings may be called by the chairman, upon the written request of at least two (2) members of the council. Three 59 60 (3) council members shall constitute a quorum of the council. SECTION 3. Section 73-65-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 61 62 reenacted as follows:

63 73-65-5. The board shall:

64 (a) Promulgate regulations necessary to carry out the65 provisions of this chapter;

66 (b) Require that all applicants register for, take and pass the national board certification exam as administered by the 67 Art Therapy Credentials Board of the American Art Therapy 68 Association; 69 70 (c) Establish the application deadline for and score 71 required to pass the examination; 72 (d) Process applications and conduct and review the required examinations; 73 74 (e) Issue certificates to applicants who meet the 75 requirements of Sections 73-65-7 through 73-65-13; 76 (f) Deny, suspend, or revoke a certificate to practice 77 art therapy; Censure, reprimand, or place a certificate holder 78 (g) or applicant on probation for a period not to exceed one (1) year; 79 Maintain a current register of certificate holders 80 (h) 81 as a matter of public record; 82 (i) Establish criteria for continuing education; Establish procedures for receiving, investigating, 83 (j) 84 and resolving complaints against certificate holders; Approve the level of supervision and experience 85 (k) 86 required for persons seeking certification; (1) Assess fees for the issuance and renewal of 87 88 certificates to cover expenses of the board in administering this chapter; 89 90 (m) Implement an impaired professional art therapist 91 treatment program; and Adopt a code of ethics as established by the 92 (n) 93 American Art Therapy Association. SECTION 4. Section 73-65-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 94 95 reenacted as follows: 96 73-65-7. (1) The board shall issue a certificate as a certified professional art therapist to any person who files a 97 98 completed application, accompanied by the required fees, and who

99 submits satisfactory evidence that the applicant is at least 100 twenty-one (21) years of age, demonstrates professional competency 101 by satisfactorily passing the required examination, is a 102 registered art therapist as defined by the Art Therapy Credentials 103 Board, Inc., is a certified art therapist as defined by the Art 104 Therapy Credentials Board, Inc., and has:

(a) Received a master's degree or doctoral degree in art therapy that includes six hundred (600) hours of supervised internship experience from an accredited institution and has completed an additional one thousand (1,000) client contact hours of postgraduate experience under appropriate supervision; or

(b) Received a master's degree or doctoral degree in a related field, has a minimum of twenty-one (21) semester hours of sequential course work in the history, theory, and practice of art therapy, has completed seven hundred (700) hours of supervised internship experience from an accredited institution, and has completed an additional two thousand (2,000) client contact hours of postgraduate experience under appropriate supervision.

117 (2) The board may approve on a case-by-case basis applicants 118 who have a master's degree or a doctoral degree from nonaccredited 119 institutions.

120 (3) If an applicant has met all of the requirements for
121 certification except satisfactorily passing the required
122 examination, the applicant shall be scheduled to take the next
123 examination following the approval of the examination.

(4) An applicant for certification as a professional art therapist may be certified without examination if the applicant files a completed application within one (1) year of July 1, 1998, accompanied by the required fees, and if the board determines that the applicant meets all other requirements for certification as a professional art therapist.

130 (5) The board may issue a certificate to an applicant131 without examination if the person possesses a valid regulatory

document issued by the appropriate examining board under the laws of any other state or territory of the United States, the District of Columbia, or any foreign nation that in the judgment of the board has requirements substantially equivalent to or exceeding the requirements in this section.

137 (6) The board may issue provisional certification as a 138 professional art therapist to any person who has completed the 139 educational requirements in subsection (1)(a) or (1)(b) of this 140 section and is fulfilling the client contact hours requirement, 141 but has not taken the examination or received registration from 142 the American Art Therapy Association (ATR).

143 (7) The board may set criteria for continuing education and144 supervisory experience.

145 SECTION 5. Section 73-65-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 146 reenacted as follows:

147 73-65-9. (1) Each certificate holder shall renew the 148 certificate to practice art therapy biennially by submitting a 149 renewal application on a form provided by the board, paying a 150 certificate renewal fee, and producing evidence of completion of 151 relevant professional continuing education experience satisfactory 152 to the board, not to exceed forty (40) hours per renewal cycle.

153 (2) A ninety-day grace period shall be allowed for each 154 certificate holder after the certification period, during which 155 time the certificate may be renewed upon payment of the renewal 156 fee, the late fee, and compliance with all renewal requirements.

157 (3) Any certificate granted by the board shall be automatically suspended if the holder fails to apply for the 158 certificate renewal pursuant to this section within a period of 159 160 three (3) months after the renewal deadline; however, any 161 suspended certificate may be restored by the board upon payment of 162 a reinstatement fee not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in addition to any unpaid renewal or late fees. Failure to renew a 163 164 certificate within three (3) months from the date of suspension as

165 provided in this section shall cause the certificate to be 166 automatically revoked. Reinstatement of a revoked certificate 167 shall require the certificate holder to reapply and meet all 168 current standards for certification.

169 (4) A person certified under the provisions of Section 170 73-65-7 who intends to retire as a certified professional art therapist shall notify the board in writing before the expiration 171 of his current certification. If, within a period of five (5) 172 173 years from the year of retirement, the certificate holder wishes 174 to resume practice as a certified professional art therapist, he 175 shall notify the board in writing, and upon giving proof of 176 completing the required continuing education and the payment of an 177 amount equivalent to elapsed renewal fees, the certificate shall be restored in full effect. 178

SECTION 6. Section 73-65-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

181 73-65-11. The board shall set the amount of the fees 182 required to be paid by applicants for certification and 183 certificate holders including, but not limited to, the following:

184 (a) For an application for initial certification, the
185 fee shall be nonrefundable and shall not exceed Two Hundred
186 Dollars (\$200.00);

187 (b) The renewal fee shall not exceed Two Hundred188 Dollars (\$200.00);

189 (c) For a duplicate or replacement certificate, the fee190 shall not exceed Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00);

(d) For failure to renew a certificate within the allotted grace period pursuant to Section 73-65-9, the fee shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00); and

194 (e) Other reasonable fees for administrative services.
 195 SECTION 7. Section 73-65-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 196 reenacted as follows:

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7 73-65-13. (1) The board may deny any application, or

198 suspend or revoke any certificate held or applied for under the provisions of Section 73-65-7 if the person: 199 200 Is found guilty of fraud, deceit, or (a) 201 misrepresentation in procuring or attempting to procure a 202 certificate to practice art therapy; 203 Is adjudicated mentally incompetent; (b) 204 Is found guilty of a felony or misdemeanor (C) 205 involving moral turpitude; Is found guilty of unprofessional or unethical 206 (d) 207 conduct in this or any other jurisdiction; 208 Has been using any controlled substance or (e) 209 alcoholic beverage to an extent or in a manner dangerous to the 210 person, any other person, or the public, or to an extent that the 211 use impairs the ability to perform as a certified professional art 212 therapist; 213 (f) Has violated any provision of this chapter; or 214 Willfully or negligently divulges a professional (g) confidence. 215 216 (2) A certified copy of the record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence of the conviction. 217 218 (3) Disciplinary proceedings may be initiated upon the receipt by the board of a sworn complaint by any person, including 219 members of the board. 220 221 SECTION 8. Section 73-65-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 222 reenacted as follows: 223 73-65-15. (1) The provisions of this chapter shall not 224 apply to persons licensed, certified, or registered under any other provisions of Mississippi law, including, but not limited 225 226 to, physicians, social workers, psychologists, and nurses, or 227 students within accredited training programs of these professions. 228 The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to "activities professionals" at licensed nursing facilities. Nothing in this 229 230 chapter shall be construed to limit, interfere with, or restrict

231 the practice, descriptions of services, or manner in which these232 persons hold themselves out to the public.

(2) No person shall use the title "certified professional
art therapist" or hold himself out as having this status, unless
he is certified as such by the board.

236 SECTION 9. Section 73-65-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 237 reenacted as follows:

73-65-17. Any person who violates the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or sentenced to three (3) months in the county jail, or both, for each violation.

243 SECTION 10. Section 73-65-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 244 amended as follows:

245 73-65-19. Sections 73-65-1 through 73-65-17 shall stand
246 repealed on July 1, <u>2004</u>.

247 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from 248 and after July 1, 2000.
