- TO CLARIFY THAT LICENSED TEACHERS ALREADY SERVING IN GEOGRAPHICAL
- CRITICAL TEACHER SHORTAGE AREAS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS
- 4 TOWARD MASTERS OR SPECIALIST DEGREES UNDER THE UNIVERSITY ASSISTED
- TEACHER RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION GRANT PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED 5
- PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 37-159-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 37-159-9. (1) There is established the University Assisted 10
- Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program within the State 11
- Department of Education. The purposes of the program shall be to 12
- attract additional qualified teachers to those geographical areas 13
- 14 of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers
- and to retain the qualified teachers already serving as licensed 15
- 16 teachers in geographical critical teacher shortage areas by making
- available scholarships to persons working towards a Master of 17
- Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree at an 18
- institution of higher learning whose teacher education program is 19
- approved by the State Board of Education. 20
- 21 (2) Any institution of higher learning in the State of
- 22 Mississippi which offers a Master of Education degree or an
- 23 Educational Specialist degree may apply to the department for

24 participation in the program. As part of the program,

25 participating institutions shall collaborate with the Mississippi

26 Teacher Center to identify, recruit and place teacher education

27 graduates, from both within the state and out-of-state, in school

28 districts situated within those areas of the state where there

29 exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State

participating institutions of higher learning for the purpose of awarding scholarships to qualified persons pursuing a Master of Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree at such institutions while rendering service to the state as a licensed teacher in a school district in a geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by the State Board of Education. The financial scholarship shall be applied to the total cost for tuition, books, materials and fees at the institution in which the student is enrolled, not to exceed an amount equal to the highest total cost of tuition, books, materials and fees assessed by a state institution of higher learning during that school year. Teachers who relocate within Mississippi from out-of-state in order to participate in the program shall be classified as residents of the state for tuition

(4) Students awarded financial scholarships under the
University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant
Program may receive such awards for a maximum of four (4) school
years; however, the maximum number of awards which may be made
shall not exceed the length of time required to complete the
number of academic hours necessary to obtain a Master of Education
degree or an Educational Specialist degree. Financial
scholarships under the program shall not be based upon an

- 56 (5) Persons relocating to a geographical area of the state
- 57 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by
- 58 the State Board of Education, to participate in the University
- 59 Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program shall be
- 60 eligible for reimbursement for their moving expenses to the
- 61 critical teacher shortage area from the State Board of Education.
- 62 The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and
- 63 regulations necessary for the administration of the relocation
- 64 expense reimbursement component of the University Assisted Teacher
- 65 Recruitment and Retention Grant Program.
- 66 (6) Subject to the availability of funds, the State Board of
- 67 Education may provide for professional development and support
- 68 services as may be necessary for the retention of teachers
- 69 participating in the program in those geographical areas of the
- 70 state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers.
- 71 (7) Any person participating in the program who fails to
- 72 complete a program of study that will enable that person to obtain
- 73 a Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist degree
- 74 shall become liable immediately to the State Board of Education
- 75 for the sum of all awards made to that person under the program,
- 76 plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the
- 77 time the person abrogates his participation in the program.
- 78 (8) As a condition for participation in the program, a
- 79 teacher shall agree to employment as a licensed teacher in a
- 80 school district located in a geographical area of the state where
- 81 there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the
- 82 State Board of Education, for a period of not less than three (3)

83	years, which shall include those years of service rendered while
84	obtaining the Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist
85	degree. However, for any person who obtained a baccalaureate
86	degree in education with a financial scholarship under the
87	Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program and who entered the
88	University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant
89	Program before rendering service as a teacher, the period of
90	employment for the purposes of this subsection shall be two (2)
91	years, in addition to the employment commitment required under the
92	Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program. Service rendered by a
93	participant as a licensed teacher in a school district in a
94	geographical critical teacher shortage area before that teacher
95	becomes a participant in the program may not be considered to
96	fulfill the employment commitment required under this subsection.
97	Any person failing to comply with this employment commitment in
98	any required school year shall immediately be in breach of
99	contract and become liable immediately to the State Department of
100	Education for the sum of all scholarships awarded and relocation
101	expenses granted to that person, less one-third $(1/3)$ of the
102	amount of that sum for each year that service was rendered, or for
103	those persons whose required period of employment is two (2)
104	years, less one-half $(1/2)$ of the amount of that sum for each year
105	that service was rendered, plus interest accruing at the current
106	Stafford Loan rate at the time the breach occurs, except in the
107	case of a deferral for cause by the State Board of Education when
108	there is no employment position immediately available upon the
109	teacher's obtaining of the Master of Education degree or
110	Educational Specialist degree. After the period of such deferral,

- 111 the person shall begin or resume the required teaching duties or
- 112 shall become liable to the board under this subsection. If a
- 113 claim for repayment under this subsection is placed in the hands
- 114 of an attorney for collection after default, then the obligor
- 115 shall be liable for an additional amount equal to a reasonable
- 116 attorney's fee.
- 117 (9) All funds received by the State Department of Education
- 118 from the repayment of scholarship awards and relocation expenses
- 119 by program participants shall be deposited in the Mississippi
- 120 Critical Teacher Shortage Fund.
- 121 (10) The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and
- 122 regulations necessary for the proper administration of the
- 123 University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant
- 124 Program.
- 125 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 126 and after July 1, 2000.
