HOUSE BILL NO. 294 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-159-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO CLARIFY THAT LICENSED TEACHERS ALREADY SERVING IN GEOGRAPHICAL 3 CRITICAL TEACHER SHORTAGE AREAS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS 4 TOWARD MASTERS OR SPECIALIST DEGREES UNDER THE UNIVERSITY ASSISTED 5 TEACHER RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION GRANT PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED 6 PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-159-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

37-159-9. (1) There is established the University Assisted 10 11 Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program within the State Department of Education. The purposes of the program shall be to 12 13 attract additional qualified teachers to those geographical areas 14 of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers and to retain the qualified teachers already serving as licensed 15 teachers in geographical critical teacher shortage areas by making 16 17 available scholarships to persons working towards a Master of 18 Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree at an institution of higher learning whose teacher education program is 19 20 approved by the State Board of Education. 21 (2) Any institution of higher learning in the State of Mississippi which offers a Master of Education degree or an 22 23 Educational Specialist degree may apply to the department for 24 participation in the program. As part of the program, 25 participating institutions shall collaborate with the Mississippi 26 Teacher Center to identify, recruit and place teacher education graduates, from both within the state and out-of-state, in school 27 districts situated within those areas of the state where there 2.8

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The State Department of Education shall provide funds to 31 (3) participating institutions of higher learning for the purpose of 32 33 awarding scholarships to qualified persons pursuing a Master of 34 Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree at such institutions while rendering service to the state as a licensed 35 36 teacher in a school district in a geographical area of the state 37 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by the State Board of Education. The financial scholarship shall be 38 applied to the total cost for tuition, books, materials and fees 39 at the institution in which the student is enrolled, not to exceed 40 41 an amount equal to the highest total cost of tuition, books, materials and fees assessed by a state institution of higher 42 43 learning during that school year. Teachers who relocate within Mississippi from out-of-state in order to participate in the 44 program shall be classified as residents of the state for tuition 45 46 purposes.

Students awarded financial scholarships under the 47 (4) 48 University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program may receive such awards for a maximum of four (4) school 49 years; however, the maximum number of awards which may be made 50 shall not exceed the length of time required to complete the 51 number of academic hours necessary to obtain a Master of Education 52 53 degree or an Educational Specialist degree. Financial 54 scholarships under the program shall not be based upon an 55 applicant's eligibility for financial aid.

(5) Persons relocating to a geographical area of the state 56 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by 57 58 the State Board of Education, to participate in the University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program shall be 59 60 eligible for reimbursement for their moving expenses to the critical teacher shortage area from the State Board of Education. 61 62 The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and 63 regulations necessary for the administration of the relocation 64 expense reimbursement component of the University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program. 65

67 Education may provide for professional development and support
68 services as may be necessary for the retention of teachers
69 participating in the program in those geographical areas of the
70 state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers.

(7) Any person participating in the program who fails to
complete a program of study that will enable that person to obtain
a Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist degree
shall become liable immediately to the State Board of Education
for the sum of all awards made to that person under the program,
plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the
time the person abrogates his participation in the program.

78 (8) As a condition for participation in the program, a 79 teacher shall agree to employment as a licensed teacher in a school district located in a geographical area of the state where 80 81 there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the 82 State Board of Education, for a period of not less than three (3) years, which shall include those years of service rendered while 83 84 obtaining the Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist 85 However, for any person who obtained a baccalaureate degree. 86 degree in education with a financial scholarship under the Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program and who entered the 87 88 University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant 89 Program before rendering service as a teacher, the period of employment for the purposes of this subsection shall be two (2) 90 91 years, in addition to the employment commitment required under the 92 Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program. Service rendered by a 93 participant as a licensed teacher in a school district in a geographical critical teacher shortage area before that teacher 94 95 becomes a participant in the program may not be considered to 96 fulfill the employment commitment required under this subsection. 97 Any person failing to comply with this employment commitment in 98 any required school year shall immediately be in breach of

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99 contract and become liable immediately to the State Department of 100 Education for the sum of all scholarships awarded and relocation 101 expenses granted to that person, less one-third (1/3) of the 102 amount of that sum for each year that service was rendered, or for 103 those persons whose required period of employment is two (2) years, less one-half (1/2) of the amount of that sum for each year 104 105 that service was rendered, plus interest accruing at the current 106 Stafford Loan rate at the time the breach occurs, except in the 107 case of a deferral for cause by the State Board of Education when 108 there is no employment position immediately available upon the teacher's obtaining of the Master of Education degree or 109 110 Educational Specialist degree. After the period of such deferral, 111 the person shall begin or resume the required teaching duties or shall become liable to the board under this subsection. 112 Tf a claim for repayment under this subsection is placed in the hands 113 114 of an attorney for collection after default, then the obligor 115 shall be liable for an additional amount equal to a reasonable 116 attorney's fee.

(9) All funds received by the State Department of Education from the repayment of scholarship awards and relocation expenses by program participants shall be deposited in the Mississippi Critical Teacher Shortage Fund.

(10) The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the proper administration of the University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program.

125 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 126 and after July 1, 2000.
