- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Legislature finds the following:
- 6 (a) The Declaration of Independence declares that
- 7 governments are instituted to secure certain unalienable rights,
- 8 including life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, with which
- 9 all human beings are endowed by their Creator and to which they
- 10 are entitled by the laws of nature and of nature's God.
- 11 (b) The organic laws of the United States Code and the
- 12 constitutions of every state, using various expressions, recognize
- 13 God as the source of the blessings of liberty.
- 14 (c) The First Amendment to the Constitution of the
- 15 United States secures rights against laws respecting an
- 16 establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise
- 17 thereof.
- 18 (d) The Tenth Amendment reserves to the states,
- 19 respectively, the powers not delegated to the United States
- 20 government nor prohibited to the states.
- 21 (e) House Resolution 4154 of the One Hundred Fifth
- 22 Congress of the United States provides that the power to display
- 23 the Ten Commandments on or within property owned or administered
- 24 by a state is declared to be among the powers reserved to the
- 25 states.
- 26 <u>(f) The Holy Bible contains many important historic</u>

- 27 <u>facts concerning the progression of the human race that should be</u>
- 28 imparted to pupils for a complete and well-rounded education.
- 29 (2) The school board of a local school district may
- 30 authorize the display of the Ten Commandments in classrooms and in
- 31 other public areas of school buildings and facilities.
- 32 <u>(3) The Holy Bible may be used as a teaching aid, provided</u>
- 33 that it is not used to advocate the practice of religion or any
- 34 <u>particular religious belief.</u>
- 35 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 36 and after July 1, 2000.
