HOUSE BILL NO. 335

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 55-15-51 THROUGH 55-15-61, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION AND PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; TO AMEND SECTION 55-15-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF REPEAL ON THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8 SECTION 1. Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9 reenacted as follows:
10 55-15-51. It is hereby found and determined by the

Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument should be established and maintained as a symbol of the recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to

17 Mississippi veterans.

18 SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 19 reenacted as follows:

55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws, 1977, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of

Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi 24 Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven 25 (7) members: 26 27 (a) The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the 28 29 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission; (b) 30 The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans Affairs Board; 31 The Director of the Division of General Services in 32 (C) the Department of Finance and Administration; 33 Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one 34 (d) (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as 35 36 follows: 37 (i) One (1) veteran of World War II; One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and (ii) 38 (iii) One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict; 39 One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict, 40 (e) appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor. 41 The initial meeting of the commission shall be called (2) 42 and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 43 44 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission 45 46 shall elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at the call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings 47 of the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along 48 with all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of 49 50 the secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All 51 actions taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission 52 53 shall be by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea and nay votes of each member present. The signature of the 54

55 chairman and secretary, pursuant to a duly adopted resolution, 56 shall be binding upon the commission.

57 The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans (3) 58 Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for each day or portion 59 thereof spent in the performance of the duties of the commission 60 61 and shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses while on commission business as authorized under Section 25-3-41. Other 62 members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation 63 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as 64 authorized under Section 25-3-41 while on commission business. 65 66 Commission members shall be limited to reimbursement of travel expenses and per diem compensation authorized herein for no more 67 68 than twelve (12) meetings per year.

(4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
Veterans Memorial Commission.

(5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.

(6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall
continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after
the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi
veterans monument for a period of one (1) year after the date on
which the Mississippi veterans monument is officially dedicated so
that such commission can provide for the design, construction and
dedication of future monuments to be located at sites designated

83 by the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission.

84 SECTION 3. Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 85 reenacted as follows:

55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created.

91 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 92 reenacted as follows:

93 55-15-57. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission94 shall:

95 (a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and
96 dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual
97 design and site of the monument shall be selected with the
98 approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.

99 (b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into100 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund.

(c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an annual report on its activities no later than November of each year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate.

107 SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 108 reenacted as follows:

109 55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is
110 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from

individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans 111 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 112 The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans 113 114 Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited 115 into the fund. All funds deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund shall be used exclusively for the purpose of designing, 116 117 erecting and maintaining the veterans monument, except that not more than Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be 118 expended annually to pay the administrative costs of the 119 120 commission. Any monies remaining unexpended or unencumbered in 121 the fund upon completion of the monument shall revert to the 122 Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission for maintenance of the Veterans monument and memorials. 123

124 SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 125 reenacted as follows:

55-15-61. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 126 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 127 128 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication 129 of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National 130 Military Park. In planning the design, construction and 131 dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and 132 be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3) 133 representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of 134 135 Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of 136 Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit 137 138 private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate

139 Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 140 Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state 141 using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature; 142 however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission 143 is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund 144 grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds 145 deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the 146 147 purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument.

148 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 149 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 150 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 151 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the Shiloh 152 Confederate Memorial Trust Fund.

153 SECTION 7. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 154 amended as follows:

155 55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through 55-15-61, Mississippi
156 Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans
157 Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, 2001.
158 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from
159 and after July 1, 2000.
