HOUSE BILL NO. 335 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 55-15-51 THROUGH 55-15-61, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION AND PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; TO AMEND 3 SECTION 55-15-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF REPEAL ON THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION; AND FOR 5 6 RELATED PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- SECTION 1. Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8
- reenacted as follows: 9
- 55-15-51. It is hereby found and determined by the 10
- 11 Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in
- the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi 12
- 13 veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve
- 14 for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument
- should be established and maintained as a symbol of the 15
- recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to 16
- 17 Mississippi veterans.
- SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 18
- reenacted as follows: 19
- 55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws, 20
- 21 1977, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership
- of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease 22
- 23 serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of
- Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi 24
- 25 Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven
- 26 (7) members:
- 27 (a) The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans
- Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the 2.8

- 29 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission;
- 30 (b) The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans
- 31 Affairs Board;
- 32 (c) The Director of the Division of General Services in
- 33 the Department of Finance and Administration;
- 34 (d) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one
- 35 (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as
- 36 follows:
- 37 (i) One (1) veteran of World War II;
- 38 (ii) One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and
- 39 (iii) One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict;
- 40 (e) One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict,
- 41 appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor.
- 42 (2) The initial meeting of the commission shall be called
- 43 and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans
- 44 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a
- 45 chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission
- 46 shall elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at
- 47 the call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings
- 48 of the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along
- 49 with all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of
- 50 the secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission
- 51 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All
- 52 actions taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission
- 53 shall be by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea
- 54 and nay votes of each member present. The signature of the
- 55 chairman and secretary, pursuant to a duly adopted resolution,
- 56 shall be binding upon the commission.
- 57 (3) The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans
- 58 Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the
- 59 amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for each day or portion
- 60 thereof spent in the performance of the duties of the commission
- 61 and shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses while

- on commission business as authorized under Section 25-3-41. Other
- 63 members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation
- 64 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as
- 65 authorized under Section 25-3-41 while on commission business.
- 66 Commission members shall be limited to reimbursement of travel
- 67 expenses and per diem compensation authorized herein for no more
- 68 than twelve (12) meetings per year.
- 69 (4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
- 70 to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
- 71 Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
- 72 Veterans Memorial Commission.
- 73 (5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
- 74 have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
- 75 pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.
- 76 (6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall
- 77 continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after
- 78 the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi
- 79 veterans monument for a period of one (1) year after the date on
- 80 which the Mississippi veterans monument is officially dedicated so
- 81 that such commission can provide for the design, construction and
- 82 dedication of future monuments to be located at sites designated
- 83 by the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission.
- SECTION 3. Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 85 reenacted as follows:
- 86 55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is
- 87 hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and
- 88 maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans
- 89 when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in
- 90 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created.
- 91 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 92 reenacted as follows:
- 93 55-15-57. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission
- 94 shall:

- 95 (a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and
- 96 dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual
- 97 design and site of the monument shall be selected with the
- 98 approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.
- 99 (b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into
- 100 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund.
- 101 (c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each
- 102 year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report
- 103 required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an
- 104 annual report on its activities no later than November of each
- 105 year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi
- 106 House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate.
- SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 108 reenacted as follows:
- 109 55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is
- 110 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from
- 111 individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans
- 112 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury.
- 113 The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans
- 114 Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited
- 115 into the fund. All funds deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust
- 116 Fund shall be used exclusively for the purpose of designing,
- 117 erecting and maintaining the veterans monument, except that not
- 118 more than Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be
- 119 expended annually to pay the administrative costs of the
- 120 commission. Any monies remaining unexpended or unencumbered in
- 121 the fund upon completion of the monument shall revert to the
- 122 Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission for maintenance of
- 123 the Veterans monument and memorials.
- 124 SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 125 reenacted as follows:
- 126 55-15-61. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the
- 127 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55,

- 128 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission
- 129 shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication
- 130 of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National
- 131 Military Park. In planning the design, construction and
- 132 dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and
- 133 be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3)
- 134 representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of
- 135 Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of
- 136 Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and
- 137 certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit
- 138 private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate
- 139 Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury.
- 140 Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state
- 141 using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature;
- 142 however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty
- 143 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission
- 144 is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund
- 145 grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds
- 146 deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the
- 147 purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument.
- 148 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing
- 149 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and
- 150 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any
- 151 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the Shiloh
- 152 Confederate Memorial Trust Fund.
- SECTION 7. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 154 amended as follows:
- 155 55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through 55-15-61, Mississippi
- 156 Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans
- 157 Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, 2001.
- 158 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 159 and after July 1, 2000.
