HOUSE BILL NO. 418 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AN EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES INTERAGENCY 1 2 COORDINATING COUNCIL; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP AND 3 ORGANIZATION OF THE COUNCIL; TO DEFINE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE 4 COUNCIL; TO ESTABLISH AN INTERAGENCY ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO THE 5 EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES INTERAGENCY COUNCIL; TO PROVIDE FOR THE 6 MEMBERSHIP, ORGANIZATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ADVISORY 7 COMMITTEE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. (1) As used in this act, the term "preschool 10 children" means any children who have not entered kindergarten. (2) To ensure that all children have access to quality early 11 childhood education and development services, the Legislature 12 finds and declares the following: 13 14 (a) Parents have the primary duty to educate their young preschool children; 15 The State of Mississippi can assist and educate 16 (b) 17 parents in their role as the primary caregivers and educators of 18 young preschool children; and (c) There is a need to explore innovative approaches 19 20 and strategies for aiding parents and families in the education and development of young preschool children. 21 22 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council is created to ensure coordination among the 23 24 various agencies and programs serving preschool children in order to support school district's efforts to achieve the goal of 25 readiness to start school, to facilitate communication, 26 cooperation and maximum use of resources and to promote high 27 28 standards for all programs serving preschool children and their

families in Mississippi. 29 30 (2) The membership of the Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council shall be as follows: 31 The State Superintendent of Public Education; 32 (a) 33 (b) The Executive Director of the State Department of 34 Health; The Executive Director of the Department of Human 35 (C) 36 Services; 37 The Executive Director of the State Department of (d) Mental Health; 38 The Executive Director of the Division of Medicaid, 39 (e) 40 Office of the Governor; 41 (f) The Executive Director of the State Department of 42 Rehabilitation Services; The Commissioner of Higher Education; 43 (q) 44 The Executive Director of the State Board for (h) Community and Junior Colleges; and 45 (i) The Executive Director of Mississippi Educational 46 Television. 47 48 The council shall meet upon call of the Governor before (3) August 1, 2000, and shall organize for business by selecting a 49 50 chairman, who shall serve for a one-year term and may be selected for subsequent terms. The council shall adopt internal 51 organizational procedures necessary for efficient operation of the 52 53 council. Council procedures must include duties of officers, a process for selecting officers, quorum requirements for conducting 54 55 business and policies for any council staff. Each member of the council shall designate necessary staff of their departments to 56 57 assist the council in performing its duties and responsibilities. 58 The council shall meet and conduct business at least quarterly. Meetings of the council must be open to the public, and 59 60 opportunity for public comment must be made available at each meeting. The chairman of the council shall notify all persons who 61 62 request such notice as to the date, time and place of each 63 meeting.

64 (4) The Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating65 Council shall perform each of the following duties:

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(a) Serve as interagency coordinating council for the various agencies and public and private programs serving preschool children and their families in the State of Mississippi;

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Advise the State Board of Health, State Board of 69 (b) 70 Education, Department of Human Services, State Department of Mental Health, Division of Medicaid, State Department of 71 72 Rehabilitation Services and any other appropriate agency of standards, rules, rule revisions, agency guidelines and 73 74 administration affecting child care facilities, prekindergarten 75 programs, family training programs and other programs and services for preschool children and families; 76

(c) Collect, compile and distribute data relating to 77 78 all programs and services for preschool children and families, 79 including, but not limited to, an inventory of the programs and services available in each county of the state, and identify and 80 81 make recommendations with regard to program areas for which an 82 unfulfilled need exists within the state for accurate and accessible information; 83

84 (d) Review and analyze spending priorities for each 85 state agency that utilizes state or federal funds in the 86 administration or provision of programs and services for preschool children and make recommendations thereon to the Legislative 87 88 Budget Committee and the Governor;

89 Publish annually, before November 1, a (e) comprehensive report on the status of all programs and services 90 91 for preschool children in Mississippi and distribute the report to 92 the Governor, the Legislature and local school districts and make 93 the report available to the general public, using the following criteria: 94

95 (i) Program name and location; 96 (ii) Dates of operation; 97 (iii) Services provided; 98 (iv) Target population and number served;

99 (v) Eligibility requirements; (vi) Funding sources; 100 101 (vii) Amount of funding per unit; 102 (viii) Annual cost; 103 (ix) Evaluation type and results; and 104 The state agency administering the program. (x) 105 (f) Receive and consider recommendations of the 106 Interagency Advisory Committee for Early Childhood Services established in Section 3; and 107

(g) Apply for, receive and administer funds for administration, research, pilot, planning and evaluation of all programs serving preschool children and their families.

(5) If any agency represented on the Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council includes a request for funding for the support of the council in the agency's annual budget request presented to the Legislative Budget Committee the Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council shall be abolished, effective on the date that the agency presents its budget request.

118 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The Interagency Advisory Committee for Early 119 Childhood Services is created to develop and make recommendations 120 to the Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council 121 established under Section 2 of this act as deemed necessary to 122 implement the council's responsibilities relating to all programs 123 serving preschool children and their families in Mississippi.

124 (2) The membership of the Interagency Advisory Committee for125 Early Childhood Services shall be as follows:

(a) The Chairmen of the Senate Education, Public Health
and Welfare and Appropriations Committees, or their Senate
designees;

(b) The Chairmen of the House Education, Public Health
and Welfare and Appropriations Committees, or their House
designees;

132 (C) A representative of the Governor; A representative of the State Department of 133 (d) 134 Education; A representative of the State Department of Health; 135 (e) 136 A representative of the Department of Human (f) 137 Services; 138 A representative of the State Department of Mental (g) 139 Health; A representative of the State Department of 140 (h) 141 Rehabilitation Services; 142 The following representatives of the early (i) childhood profession: 143 144 (i) The President of the Mississippi Head Start 145 Association; 146 (ii) A representative from a regulated family 147 child care home network appointed by the Governor; 148 (iii) A representative from a licensed child care center appointed by the President of the Senate; 149 150 (iv) A representative from a public school prekindergarten program appointed by the Speaker of the House; 151 152 (v) A representative from a private school 153 prekindergarten program appointed by the Governor; 154 (vi) A representative from a half-day church 155 sponsored prekindergarten program appointed by the Speaker of the 156 House; 157 (vii) A representative from a university or college early childhood program appointed by the President of the 158 159 Senate; 160 (viii) A representative of a tribal early 161 childhood program appointed by the Governor; 162 (ix) A representative of an early childhood professional organization appointed by the President of the 163 164 Senate;

165 (x) A representative of an advocacy organization 166 appointed by the Speaker of the House; and

167 (xi) A representative of a community or junior 168 college early childhood program appointed by the Governor; 169 (j) A parent of a preschool-age child appointed by the 170 Governor;

171 (k) A parent of a preschool-age child with special172 needs appointed by the Speaker of the House;

(1) A representative of the cooperative extensionservices appointed by the President of the Senate;

(m) A physician who is a member of the Mississippi Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, appointed by the Director of the University Medical Center;

178 (n) The Director of the Mississippi Public Education179 Forum, or his designee; and

180 (o) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Economic181 Council, or his designee.

To the extent possible, any representative of a state agency designated to serve on the Interagency Advisory Committee shall be the same individual designated to assist the Interagency Coordinating Council in performing its duties and responsibilities.

The advisory committee shall meet upon call of the Early 187 (3) 188 Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council before August 1, 2000, and the council shall appoint a chairman from among the 189 190 membership of the advisory committee. The chairman shall serve for a one-year term and may be reappointed for subsequent terms. 191 The advisory committee shall adopt internal organizational 192 procedures necessary for efficient operation of the advisory 193 committee and may establish subcommittees for conducting specific 194 195 programs and activities. Advisory committee procedures must include duties of officers, a process for selecting officers, 196 197 duties of subcommittees, quorum requirements for conducting

198 business and policies for any staff. The members of the Early 199 Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council shall 200 designate necessary staff of their departments to assist the advisory committee in performing its duties and responsibilities. 201 202 The advisory committee shall meet and conduct business at least quarterly. Quarterly meetings of the advisory committee shall be 203 204 open to the public, and opportunity for public comment must be 205 made available at each meeting. The staff of the advisory 206 committee shall notify all persons who request such notice as to 207 the date, time and place of each meeting.

(4) The Interagency Advisory Committee for Early Childhood
Services, in addition to responsibilities assigned by the Early
Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council, shall perform
each of the following duties:

(a) Assist in the implementation of the study conducted
by the Task Force on the Development and Implementation of
Comprehensive Early Childhood Services in Mississippi established
under Senate Bill No. 2618, 1999 Regular Session;

(b) Identify services to children which impact earlychildhood development and education;

(c) Identify and recommend methods to facilitate interagency coordination of service programs for preschool children;

(d) Serve as a forum for information exchange regarding recommendations and priorities in early childhood development and education; and

(e) Advise and make recommendations to the Interagency
 Coordinating Council as deemed necessary to effectuate the
 council's responsibilities.

227 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 228 and after July 1, 2000.
