HOUSE BILL NO. 682

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO 2 ESTABLISH A SCHOOL VOUCHER PROGRAM; TO DEFINE CERTAIN TERMS 3 RELATING TO THE PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT PARENTS MEETING CERTAIN 4 INCOME REQUIREMENTS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE VOUCHERS FROM THE 5 DEPARTMENT WHICH MAY BE USED FOR THE EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES OF THEIR CHILDREN ATTENDING PARTICIPATING APPROVED NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS; TO 6 7 PROVIDE THAT THE VALUE OF A VOUCHER SHALL NOT EXCEED \$2,500.00; TO 8 ESTABLISH A PROCESS FOR NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS TO BE CERTIFIED FOR 9 PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM; TO ESTABLISH A PROCEDURE FOR THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REDEEM VOUCHERS SUBMITTED BY 10 11 PARTICIPATING NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS; TO REQUIRE CERTAIN INFORMATION TO BE REPORTED TO THE DEPARTMENT BY PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS; TO 12 AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT RULES AND 13 REGULATIONS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED 14 15 PURPOSES.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 17 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The following words and phrases, as used in 18 this section, shall have the meanings ascribed in this subsection 19 unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Approved nonpublic school" means an elementary or
secondary school in the state which maintains educational
standards equivalent to the standards establish by the State
Department of Education for the state schools as outlined in the
Approval Requirements of the State Board of Education for
Nonpublic Schools and which is certified by the department as
eligible to receive vouchers.

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(b) "Department" means the State Department of

(c) "Eligible parent, guardian or custodian" means a person who is head of a household whose family's adjusted gross income for the prior year is less than Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) or, in the case of a single parent, guardian or custodian who is head of a household, whose adjusted gross income for the prior year is less than Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00).

36 (d) "Voucher" means a document issued by the State
37 Board of Education to an eligible parent, guardian or custodian of
38 a student which may be exchanged by an approved nonpublic school
39 with the board for money for the educational expenses of the
40 student attending that school.

41 (2) The State Department of Education shall establish and implement a program in which an eligible parent, guardian or 42 43 custodian, upon request, may receive from the department a voucher that may be used for educational services at a participating 44 approved nonpublic school selected by the child's parent, guardian 45 or custodian. The parent, guardian or custodian to whom a voucher 46 is issued may use the voucher only if the child is admitted to a 47 participating approved nonpublic school. Upon the child's 48 admittance to the nonpublic school, the parent, guardian or 49 50 custodian shall present the voucher to the school. The value of the voucher shall be Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) 51 or a sum equal to the actual cost of tuition and fees annually 52 53 charged by the approved nonpublic school, whichever is less. A 54 participating approved nonpublic school may not charge additional tuition to any student enrolled in the school under the voucher 55 56 program.

57 (3) If an approved nonpublic school desires to be certified58 by the department as eligible to participate in the voucher

59 program, the school shall apply to the department for

60 certification as a participating approved nonpublic school. The 61 department shall prepare and make available to approved nonpublic 62 schools a form for the application process. The department shall 63 conduct such investigation and inquiries as it deems necessary to 64 determine the qualifications of the approved nonpublic school to 65 be certified for participation in the voucher program.

66 Certification as a participating approved nonpublic school shall 67 be valid for each succeeding school year unless revoked by the 68 department or upon the request of the school.

69 (4) On behalf of each eligible parent, guardian or custodian 70 to whom a voucher is issued, the department shall pay to a 71 participating approved nonpublic school a sum equal to the total 72 value of all vouchers submitted by the nonpublic school to the 73 department for redemption. The total annual payment to which the 74 nonpublic school is entitled shall be made in periodic payments 75 throughout the year, at the same time and in the same manner state 76 funds are distributed to school districts by the department. Each 77 payment shall be in the same proportion to the total annual 78 payment to which the nonpublic school is entitled as the portion 79 of the school year which the payment is intended to cover bears to 80 the total school year. The periodic payments may be adjusted by 81 the department as necessary to account for changes in the 82 enrollment of students in the participating approved nonpublic 83 school or other changes affecting the total annual payment to 84 which the nonpublic school is entitled. The department shall pay 85 the remainder of the amount of the base student cost funded by the 86 state for each student participating in the voucher program to the

87 school district from which the student transfers for the purpose 88 of attending the approved nonpublic school.

89 (5) The department shall require each approved nonpublic 90 school in which students are admitted under the voucher program to provide to the department a record of the students' enrollment and 91 periodic reports of the students' continued enrollment in and 92 attendance at the nonpublic school. The department also shall 93 94 require assurance from each participating approved nonpublic 95 school that the school does not discriminate in the admission of students on the basis of race, sex, disability, color or economic 96 97 status.

98 (6) The State Board of Education shall adopt such rules and 99 regulations that may be necessary in the implementation of this 100 section, including an application process and deadline for 101 accepting requests for vouchers from parents, guardians and 102 custodians.

103 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 104 and after July 1, 2000.
