HOUSE BILL NO. 712 (As Passed the House)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-14-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO INCREASE THE SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH LICENSES 3 AND PERMITS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 45-14-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 45-14-31. All initial application and registration fee and annual fees due under this section shall be paid directly to the 8 9 agency for deposit into the Radiological Health Operations Fund in 10 the State Treasury. The Mississippi State Board of Health shall submit its separate budget for carrying out the provisions of this 11 12 chapter. Said budget shall be subject to and shall comply with 13 the requirements of the state budget law. In order to supplement state radiological health budget allocations authorized to carry 14 out and enforce the provisions of this chapter, the agency is 15 hereby authorized to charge and collect fees in accordance with 16 17 the following schedules: SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL LICENSES 18 19 Category Application Fee Annual Fee 20 I. The licensee will 57 dispose of radioactive ash by transfer to another person authorized 58 to receive or dispose of this material. 59

226 SERVICES 227 Each person who assembles, installs or services radiation 228 machines within the State of Mississippi shall pay an annual 229 registration fee of <u>Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00)</u>. SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR ACCELERATORS 230 Fees for the initial registration and annual fees of each 231 232 accelerator shall be Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$550.00). SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR NEUTRON GENERATOR REGISTRATIONS 233 234 Fees for initial registration and annual fees for \* \* \* neutron generators shall be Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00). 235 SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR NUCLEAR REACTORS 236 A person possessing a Nuclear Regulatory Commission license 237 or permit authorizing a nuclear reactor in the State of 238 239 Mississippi for commercial production of electrical energy 240 utilizing special nuclear material sufficient to form a critical 241 mass, shall pay an annual fee of <u>Seventeen Dollars (\$17.00)</u> per megawatt (thermal) rating for each such reactor so licensed or 242 243 permitted. When more than one (1) reactor is on the same site, the fee or sum of each additional reactor after the first shall be 244 245 Five Dollars (\$5.00) per megawatt (thermal). SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR OUT-OF-STATE LICENSES, 246 **REGISTRANTS AND PERMITTEES** 247 248 An out-of-state person possessing: A license from the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory 249 (a) 250 Commission; 251 A license or registration from an Agreement State (b) 252 or Licensing State; or 253 (c) A registration or permit from a state radiological 254 health program; and who enters the State of Mississippi to conduct 255 the activities authorized in such license, registration or permit shall pay an annual fee in accordance with the above fee 256 257 schedules.

258 SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR TANNING EQUIPMENT

Fees for the initial registration and annual renewal of each unit of tanning equipment shall be <u>Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00)</u>. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2000.
