HOUSE BILL NO. 729 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 37-143-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ESTABLISH A MEDICAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM TO PROVIDE UP TO 20 NEW RECIPIENTS EACH YEAR WITH A FULL SCHOLARSHIP TO OBTAIN A MEDICAL EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AT NO COST; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM SHALL 5 BE ADMINISTERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF б 7 HIGHER LEARNING; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM SHALL BE FUNDED FROM 8 MONIES APPROPRIATED FROM THE HEALTH CARE EXPENDABLE FUND; TO 9 PROVIDE THAT SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS MUST AGREE TO PRACTICE FAMILY MEDICINE FOR AT LEAST TEN YEARS IN AN AREA OF THE STATE THAT IS A CRITICAL NEEDS AREA FOR PRIMARY MEDICAL CARE; TO ESTABLISH A 10 11 12 COMMITTEE THAT WILL ANNUALLY DETERMINE AND DESIGNATE THE CRITICAL NEEDS AREAS IN WHICH SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS MAY PRACTICE IN ORDER 13 TO FULFILL THEIR CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATION; TO PROVIDE THAT IF A SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT LEAVES MEDICAL SCHOOL OR HIS OR HER 14 15 16 RESIDENCY BEFORE COMPLETION OR LEAVES PRACTICING FAMILY MEDICINE 17 IN A CRITICAL NEEDS AREA BEFORE THE END OF TEN YEARS, THE FULL 18 AMOUNT THAT THE RECIPIENT RECEIVED UNDER THE SCHOLARSHIP SHALL BE 19 DUE AND PAYABLE WITHIN 90 DAYS, TOGETHER WITH INTEREST; AND FOR 20 RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 22 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section
- 23 37-143-6, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 37-143-6. (1) There is established a medical education
- 25 scholarship program, which shall be administered by the Board of
- 26 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning. The program
- 27 shall provide a certain number of eligible applicants each year
- 28 with a full scholarship to obtain a medical education at the
- 29 University of Mississippi School of Medicine at no cost to the
- 30 recipient, if the recipient meets the conditions upon which the
- 31 scholarship is granted.
- 32 (2) The program shall provide scholarships to up to twenty

33 (20) new recipients each year, and the program shall be funded

34 from monies appropriated from the Health Care Expendable Fund

37 trustees for that purpose. The amounts that may be expended

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44 (3) The scholarship shall be in an amount that will pay the 45 full cost of attendance, as defined by federal law and regulation, 46 at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine for the entire 47 time necessary for the recipient to complete the requirements for 48 a medical degree. The actual amount of the scholarship shall be 49 determined by the Office of Financial Aid of the University of

Mississippi Medical Center but shall not exceed Twenty Five

51 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per year for any recipient.

(4) Before being granted a scholarship, each applicant shall enter into a contract with the board of trustees, which shall be deemed a contract with the State of Mississippi, agreeing to the terms and conditions upon which the scholarship will be granted. In order to receive a scholarship under the program, the recipient must agree in the contract to practice family medicine for a period of not less than ten (10) years after completion of his or her residency in an area of the state that is a critical needs area for primary medical care at the time of the recipient's entry

61 into medical practice. The determination and designation of the

62 areas of the state that are critical needs areas for primary

63 medical care shall be made by a committee to be known as the

64 Medical Care Critical Needs Committee, which shall be composed of

65 the following persons: the Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs of

66 the University of Mississippi Medical Center, who shall be 67 chairman of the committee; the Executive Director of the State 68 Department of Health; the Executive Director of the Division of Medicaid; the President of the Mississippi State Medical 69 70 Association or his designee; the President of the Mississippi 71 State Hospital Association or his designee; and the Executive 72 <u>Director of the Mississippi Primary Health Care Association.</u> The committee shall meet at least once annually to determine and 73 74 designate the areas of the state that are critical needs areas for 75 primary medical care in which scholarship recipients may practice family medicine in order to fulfill their contractual obligation. 76 77 (5) If a scholarship recipient leaves the University of 78 Mississippi School of Medicine before graduation, or leaves his or 79 her residency before completion, or fails to practice family medicine for a period of ten (10) years in a critical needs area 80 81 for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care 82 Critical Needs Committee under subsection (4) of this section, the 83 full amount that the recipient received under the scholarship 84 shall be due and payable within ninety (90) days, together with 85 interest. The amount of interest due shall be equal to the annual 86 rate of return on the Health Care Trust Fund established under Section 43-13-405 for each year from the time the recipient 87 88 received the scholarship money until the time the scholarship money is repaid. The board of trustees may bring suit against any 89 90 scholarship recipient to recover the amount due to the state under 91 this section for the recipient's failure to comply with the 92 conditions upon which the scholarship was granted, as provided in 93 this section and in the contract between the recipient and the board of trustees. The board of trustees is authorized to 94 95 postpone or forgive the repayment of all or part of the amount 96 that a recipient received under the scholarship and the interest that would otherwise be due under this subsection if the 97 recipient's failure to comply with the conditions upon which the 98

- 99 scholarship was granted was due to circumstances beyond the
- 100 recipient's control that caused the recipient to be physically
- 101 unable to comply with those conditions, such as suffering a severe
- 102 illness, injury or other disabling condition.
- 103 (6) The board of trustees shall establish such rules and
- 104 regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry out the
- 105 purposes and intent of this section.
- 106 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 107 and after July 1, 2000.
