## HOUSE BILL NO. 746

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-35-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THAT CERTAIN COURSES NECESSARY FOR OBTAINING A REAL ESTATE 3 BROKER OR SALESPERSON LICENSE SHALL BE APPROVED BY THE REAL ESTATE 4 COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 73-35-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

73-35-7. Licenses shall be granted only to persons who are 8 9 trustworthy and competent to transact the business of a real estate broker or real estate salesperson in such manner as to 10 safeguard the interests of the public. Every applicant for a 11 12 resident license as a real estate broker: (a) shall be age 13 twenty-one (21) years or over, a citizen of the United States, and 14 have his legal domicile in the State of Mississippi at the time he applies; (b) shall be subject to the jurisdiction of this state, 15 subject to the income tax laws and other excise laws thereof, 16 17 subject to the road and bridge privilege tax laws thereof; (c) shall not be an elector in any other state; (d) shall have held a 18 19 license as an active real estate salesperson for twelve (12) 20 months immediately prior to making application for the broker's 21 examination; and (e) shall have successfully completed a minimum 22 of one hundred twenty (120) classroom hours of courses in real

23 estate, which courses are approved by the Mississippi Real Estate 24 Commission, (a semester-hour credit equals fifteen (15) classroom hours and a quarter-hour credit equals ten (10) classroom hours), 25 26 or have successfully completed a minimum of one hundred twenty (120) classroom hours of real estate education, (i) with the first 27 28 ninety (90) classroom hours of real estate education as provided 29 in Graduate Realtors Institute Courses 1, 2 and 3 as approved by the Mississippi Association of Realtors, Incorporated, and the 30 31 National Association of Realtors, Incorporated, and (ii) with the next thirty (30) classroom hours as provided in Graduate Realtors 32 33 Institute Course 4 as approved by the Mississippi Association of Realtors, Incorporated; or in lieu of Graduate Realtors Institute 34 35 Course 4, successful completion of a minimum of thirty (30) 36 classroom hours of real estate education provided through an approved professional designation program of an institute, society 37 38 or council of the National Association of Realtors, Incorporated, 39 or thirty (30) classroom hours in college courses in real estate acceptable for credit toward a degree in the manner hereinabove 40 provided in this paragraph. 41

An applicant who has not held an active real estate 42 43 salesperson's license for a period of at least twelve (12) months 44 immediately prior to submitting an application shall have 45 successfully completed a minimum of one hundred fifty (150) classroom hours in real estate courses, which courses are approved 46 by the Mississippi Real Estate Commission, or shall have 47 successfully completed one hundred fifty (150) classroom hours of 48 49 real estate education (i) with at least the first ninety (90) classroom hours as provided in the Graduate Realtors Institute, 50 51 with Courses 1, 2 and 3 being approved by the Mississippi 52 Association of Realtors, Incorporated, and the National Association of Realtors, Incorporated, and (ii) with the next 53

54 thirty (30) classroom hours as provided in the Graduate Realtors 55 Institute Course 4 as approved by the Mississippi Association of Realtors, Incorporated, and (iii) with successful completion of a 56 57 minimum of thirty (30) classroom hours of real estate education 58 provided through an approved professional designation program of an institute, society or council of the National Association of 59 60 Realtors, Incorporated, or thirty (30) classroom hours of college courses in real estate acceptable for credit toward a degree in 61 the manner hereinabove provided in this paragraph; or in lieu of 62 63 the preceding combination in items (ii) and (iii), successful 64 completion of sixty (60) classroom hours of real estate education 65 provided through an approved, professional designation program of an institute, society or council of the National Association of 66 67 Realtors, Incorporated. The last sixty (60) classroom hours enumerated in this section may be substituted for by successfully 68 completing two (2) three-semester-hour courses in real estate that 69 70 would be acceptable toward a degree at a college or university as 71 approved by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools or 72 the comparable regional accrediting authority, provided the 73 applicant meets other such qualifications of the preceding 74 paragraph. Certification of the successful completion of the 75 above courses shall be sent to the commission office with the 76 application to take the broker's examination.

No broker's license shall be issued to a partnership, association, company or corporation unless all the members, owners or officers thereof who will actively engage in the real estate business will be licensed as brokers on active status.

81 Every applicant for a resident license as a real estate

82 salesperson shall be age eighteen (18) years or over, shall be a 83 citizen of the United States and a bona fide resident of the State 84 of Mississippi prior to filing his application, and shall have 85 successfully completed a minimum of sixty (60) classroom hours in 86 courses in real estate, which courses are approved by the 87 Mississippi Real Estate Commission, or shall have successfully 88 completed a minimum of sixty (60) classroom hours of real estate education as provided in Graduate Realtors Institute Courses 1 and 89 90 2 approved by the Mississippi Association of Realtors, 91 Incorporated, and the National Association of Realtors, 92 Incorporated. Certification of the successful completion of 93 either of the above courses shall be sent to the commission with 94 the application to take the salesperson's examination.

95 No regulation, rule or interpretation shall be adopted or applied which establishes additional qualifications other than 96 97 those established under this section. Any existing regulation, 98 rule or interpretation which is not in accord with this section is 99 hereby abrogated and is without effect. The \* \* \* commission 100 shall publish and supply regulations consistent with this section 101 to replace existing publications which are contrary to this 102 section.

103 The educational requirements set forth in this section shall 104 be effective on July 1, 1994. Provided, those persons holding an 105 active broker's or salesperson's license on July 1, 1994, shall 106 not be required to meet the provisions of this section with regard 107 to the particular license which they hold at that time. The 108 residency requirements set forth in this section shall not apply 109 to those licensees of other states who qualify and obtain

110 nonresident licenses in this state.

111 The commission is authorized to exempt from such prelicensing 112 educational requirements, in whole or in part, a real estate 113 licensee of another state who desires to obtain a license under 114 this chapter; provided, however, that the prelicensing educational 115 requirements in the other state are determined by the commission to be equivalent to prelicensing educational requirements in this 116 117 state and provided that such state extends this same privilege or exemption to Mississippi real estate licensees. 118

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2000.
