HOUSE BILL NO. 748

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-46, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 PROVIDE THAT THE PROCEEDS FROM THE FEE FOR DRIVER'S LICENSE 3 REINSTATEMENT SHALL BE USED TO FUND HEALTH INSURANCE FOR RETIRED 4 STATE TROOPERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 63-1-46, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 63-1-46. (1) A fee of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) shall be 8 9 charged for the reinstatement of a license issued pursuant to this 10 article to every person whose license has been validly suspended, revoked or cancelled. This fee shall be in addition to the fee 11 12 provided for in Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972. 13 (2) The funds received under the provisions of subsection 14 (1) of this section shall be deposited into a special fund in the 15 State Treasury which shall be used to fund health insurance for retired enforcement troopers of the Department of Public Safety. 16 17 (3) In addition to the fee provided for in subsection (1) of this section, an additional fee of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) 18 19 shall be charged for the reinstatement of a license issued 20 pursuant to this article to every person whose license has been 21 suspended or revoked under the provisions of the Mississippi 22 Implied Consent Law or as a result of a conviction of a violation

(4) The funds received under the provisions of subsection 25 (3) of this section shall be placed in a special fund hereby 26 created in the State Treasury. Monies in such special fund may be 27 28 expended solely to contribute to the Disability and Relief Fund 29 for members of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol such amounts 30 as are necessary to make sworn agents of the Mississippi Bureau of 31 Narcotics who were employed by such bureau prior to December 1, 1990, and who were subsequently employed as enforcement troopers 32 by the Department of Public Safety, full members of the retirement 33 system for the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol with full credit 34 35 for the time they were employed as sworn agents for the 36 Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics. The Board of Trustees of the Public Employees' Retirement System shall certify to the State 37 38 Treasurer the amounts necessary for the purposes described above. The State Treasurer shall monthly transfer from the special fund 39 created pursuant to this subsection the amounts deposited in such 40 special fund to the Disability and Relief Fund for members of the 41 Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol until such time as the certified 42 43 amount has been transferred. At such time as the certified amount has been transferred, the State Treasurer shall transfer any funds 44 45 remaining in the special fund created pursuant to this subsection to the State General Fund and shall then dissolve such special 46 fund. This subsection (4) of Section 3 shall stand repealed at 47 such time when the State Treasurer transfers funds and dissolves 48 49 the special fund account in accordance with the provisions of this 50 subsection.

51 (5) The procedure for the reinstatement of a license issued 52 pursuant to this article that has been suspended for being out of 53 compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section 2 of

H. B. No. 748 00\HR07\R1272 PAGE 2 54 this act, and the payment of any fees for the reinstatement of a 55 license suspended for that purpose, shall be governed by Section 56 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be.

57 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 58 and after July 1, 2000.
