HOUSE BILL NO. 875

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-13-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 INCREASE THE SALARY FOR COURT REPORTERS FOR CIRCUIT AND CHANCERY 3 COURTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 9-13-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 9-13-19. (1) Court reporters for circuit and chancery courts shall be paid an annual salary of Forty-three Thousand 8 Dollars (\$43,000.00) payable by the Administrative Office of 9 10 Courts. In addition, any court reporter performing the duties of 11 a court administrator in the same judicial district in which the person is employed as a court reporter may be paid additional 12 compensation for performing the court administrator duties. The 13 annual amount of the additional compensation shall be set by vote 14 15 of the judges and chancellors for whom the court administrator 16 duties are performed, with consideration given to the number of 17 hours per month devoted by the court reporter to performing the duties of a court administrator. The additional compensation 18 shall be submitted to the Administrative Office of Courts for 19 20 approval.

21 (2) The several counties in each respective court district

shall transfer from the general funds of those county treasuries 22 23 to the Administrative Office of Courts a proportionate amount to be paid toward the annual compensation of the court reporter, 24 25 including any additional compensation paid for the performance of court administrator duties. The amount to be paid by each county 26 27 shall be determined by the number of weeks in which court is held in each county in proportion to the total number of weeks court is 28 29 held in the district. For purposes of this section, the term 30 "compensation" means the gross salary plus all amounts paid for benefits, or otherwise, as a result of employment or as required 31 by employment, but does not include transcript fees otherwise 32 authorized to be paid by or through the counties. However, only 33 34 salary earned for services rendered shall be reported and credited 35 for retirement purposes. Amounts paid for transcript fees, benefits or otherwise, including reimbursement for travel 36 37 expenses, shall not be reported or credited for retirement 38 purposes.

For example, if there are thirty-eight (38) scheduled court weeks in a particular district, a county in which court is scheduled five (5) weeks out of the year would have to pay five-thirty-eighths (5/38) of the total annual compensation.

43 (3) The salary and any additional compensation for the 44 performance of court administrator duties shall be paid in twelve (12) installments on the last working day of each month after it 45 has been duly authorized by the appointing judge or chancellor and 46 an order duly placed on the minutes of the court. Each county 47 48 shall transfer to the Administrative Office of Courts one-twelfth (1/12) of the amount required to be paid pursuant to subsection 49 50 (2) of this section by the twentieth day of each month for the 51 salary that is to be paid on the last working day of the month. The Administrative Office of Courts shall pay to the court 52

H. B. No. 875 00\HR07\R1307 PAGE 2 53 reporter the total amount of salary due for that month. Any 54 county may pay, in the discretion of the board of supervisors, by 55 the twentieth day of January of any year, the amount due for a 56 full twelve (12) months.

57 (4) From and after October 1, 1996, all circuit and chancery
58 court reporters will be employees of the Administrative Office of
59 Courts.

60 (5) No circuit or chancery court reporter shall be entitled
61 to any compensation for any special or extended term of court
62 after passage of this section.

63 (6) No chancery or circuit court reporter shall practice law64 in the court within which he or she is the court reporter.

65 (7) For all travel required in the performance of official duties, the circuit or chancery court reporter shall be paid 66 67 mileage by the county in which the duties were performed at the same rate as provided for state employees in Section 25-3-41. The 68 69 court reporter shall file in the office of the clerk of the court 70 which he serves a certificate of mileage expense incurred during that term and payment of such expense to the court reporter shall 71 72 be paid on allowance by the judge of such court.

73 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from74 and after October 1, 2000.
