HOUSE BILL NO. 880 (As Passed the House)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-29-313, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE PROHIBITION AGAINST PRECURSORS; TO REVISE THE LIST 3 OF PRECURSORS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 41-29-313, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 41-29-313. (1) (a) Except as authorized in this section, 8 it is unlawful for any person to knowingly or intentionally: 9 (i) Purchase, possess, transfer or distribute any two (2) or more of the listed precursor chemicals or drugs in any 10 amount with the intent to unlawfully manufacture a controlled 11 12 substance; 13 (ii) Purchase, possess, transfer or distribute any two (2) or more of the listed precursor chemicals or drugs in any 14 15 amount, knowing, or having probable cause to believe, that the listed precursor chemical or drug will be used to unlawfully 16 manufacture a controlled substance; 17 (b) Any person who violates this subsection (1), upon 18 conviction, is guilty of a felony and may be imprisoned for a 19 20 period not to exceed thirty (30) years and shall be fined not less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) nor more than One Million 21 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), or both fine and imprisonment. 22 (2) (a) It is unlawful for any person to knowingly or 23 intentionally steal or unlawfully take or carry away any amount of 24 anhydrous ammonia. 25 26 (b) It is unlawful for any person to purchase, possess,

No. 880 00\HR07\R1385 PAGE 1 27 transfer or distribute any amount of anhydrous ammonia, knowing, or having probable cause to believe, that the anhydrous ammonia 28 29 will be used to unlawfully manufacture a controlled substance. (c) It is unlawful for any person to purchase, possess, 30 31 transfer or distribute two hundred fifty (250) dosage units or 32 fifteen (15) grams in weight (dosage unit and weight as defined in Section 41-29-139) of psuedoephedrine or ephedrine, knowing, or 33 having probable cause to believe, that the psuedoephedrine or 34 ephedrine will be used to unlawfully manufacture a controlled 35 36 substance. (d) Any person who violates this subsection (2), upon 37 38 conviction, is guilty of a felony and may be imprisoned for a period not to exceed five (5) years and shall be fined not more 39 than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both fine and 40 41 imprisonment. 42 (3) The terms "listed precursor drug or chemical" means a 43 precursor drug or chemical that, in addition to legitimate uses, may be used in manufacturing a controlled substance in violation 44 of this chapter. Such term includes any salt, optical isomer or 45 salt of an optical isomer, whenever the existence of such salt, 46 47 optical isomer or salt of optical isomer is possible within the specific chemical designation. The chemicals or drugs listed in 48 49 this section are included by whatever official, common, usual, 50 chemical or trade name designated. The following are "listed 51 precursor <u>drugs</u> or <u>chemicals</u>": 52 (a) * * * Ether; 53 Anhydrous ammonia; (b) 54 (C) Pseudoephedrine;

66	(o) Hydrogen chloride gas;
67	(p) Potassium;
68	(q) Methanol;
69	(r) Isopropyl alcohol;
70	(s) Hexanes;
71	<u>(t) Heptanes;</u>
72	<u>(u) Acetone;</u>

75	(4) Nothing in this act shall preclude any farmer from
76	storing or using any of the listed precursor <u>drugs</u> or <u>chemicals</u>
77	listed in this section in the normal pursuit of farming
78	operations.
79	(5) Nothing in this act shall preclude any wholesaler,
80	retailer or pharmacist from possessing or selling the listed
81	precursor drugs or chemicals in the normal pursuit of business.
82	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
83	and after its passage.
