5	SECTION 1. Section 97-3-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
6	amended as follows:[HS1]
7	97-3-37. (1) The willful killing of an unborn quick child,
8	by an injury to the mother of such child, which would be murder if
9	it resulted in the death of the mother, shall be manslaughter.
LO	(2) A person who intentionally injures a pregnant woman is
L1	quilty of a crime as follows:
L2	(a) If the conduct results in a miscarriage or
L3	stillbirth by that individual, a felony punishable by imprisonment
L4	for not more than thirty (30) years or a fine of not more than
L5	Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00), or both.
L6	(b) If the conduct results in great bodily harm to the
L7	embryo or fetus, a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more
L8	than twenty (20) years or a fine of not more than Five Thousand
L9	Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both.
20	(c) If the conduct results in serious or aggravated
21	physical injury to the embryo or fetus, a misdemeanor punishable
22	by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year or a fine of not
23	more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or both.
24	(d) If the conduct results in physical injury to the
25	embryo or fetus, a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not
26	more than ninety (90) days or a fine of not more than Five Hundred

- 27 <u>Dollars (\$500.00)</u>, or both.
