HOUSE BILL NO. 932 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-5-319, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO REVISE THE REQUIREMENT THAT ALL EMERGENCY TELEPHONE (911) CALLS AND RECORDINGS THEREOF BE KEPT CONFIDENTIAL; TO MAKE 3 4 NONIDENTIFYING RECORDS AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 19-5-319, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:[LH1] 19-5-319. (1) Automatic number identification (ANI), 9 10 automatic location identification (ALI) and geographic automatic 11 location identification (GeoALI) information that consist of the name, address and telephone number of telephone or wireless 12 13 subscribers shall be confidential, and the dissemination of the 14 information contained in the 911 automatic number and location data base is prohibited except for the following purpose: the 15 information will be provided to the Public Safety Answering Point 16 (PSAP) on a call-by-call basis only for the purpose of handling 17 emergency calls or for training, and any permanent record of the 18 information shall be secured by the Public Safety Answering Point 19 (PSAP) and disposed of in a manner which will retain that 20 21 security, except upon court order or subpoena from a court of competent jurisdiction or as otherwise provided by law. 2.2 23 (2) All emergency telephone calls and telephone call transmissions received pursuant to Section 19-5-301 et seq., and 2.4 all <u>recordings</u> of the emergency telephone calls, shall remain 25 confidential and shall be used only for the purposes as may be 26

needed for law enforcement, fire medical rescue or other emergency

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28 services. These <u>recordings</u> shall not be released to any other 29 parties without court order or subpoena from a court of competent 30 jurisdiction.

(3) PSAP and emergency response entities shall maintain and, 31 32 upon request, release a record of the date of call, time of call, 33 the time the emergency response entity was notified, and the identity of the emergency response entity. The emergency response 34 entity shall maintain and, upon request, release a record of the 35 date and time the call was received by the emergency response 36 37 entity and the time the emergency response entity arrived on the scene. Requests for release of records must be made in writing 38 and must specify the information desired. Requestors shall pay 39 the cost of providing the information requested in accordance with 40 the Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983, Section 25-61-1, et 41 seq. The identity of any caller or person or persons who are the 42 subject of any call, or the address, phone number or other 43 identifying information about any such person, shall not be 44 45 released except as provided in subsection (2) of this section. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 46 47 and after July 1, 2000.
