## HOUSE BILL NO. 955

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-17-67, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE OFFENSE OF MALICIOUS MISCHIEF; AND FOR RELATED 3 PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 97-17-67, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:[BD1]

7 97-17-67. (1) Every person who shall maliciously or mischievously destroy, disfigure, or injure, or cause to be 8 9 destroyed, disfigured, or injured, any property of another, either 10 real or personal, with a value of less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), shall be guilty of malicious mischief, a misdemeanor, 11 12 and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in a sum twofold the 13 value of the property destroyed or of the damage done, or be imprisoned not exceeding twelve (12) months in the county jail. 14 Anyone who by any word, deed or act directly or indirectly urges, 15 aids, abets, suggests or otherwise instills in the mind of another 16 17 the will to so act shall be considered a principal in the commission of said crime and shall be punished in the same manner. 18 (2) Any person who violates subsection (1) where the value 19 20 of the property is One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or more shall be guilty of felony malicious mischief and upon conviction shall 21 22 be fined in a sum twofold the value of the property destroyed or of the damage done or be imprisoned for not more than five (5) 23 years, or both. Anyone who by any word, deed or act directly or 24 indirectly urges, aids abets, suggests or otherwise instills in 25 the mind of another the will to so act shall be considered a 26
