HOUSE BILL NO. 982

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 31-8-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THAT AN ELECTION BE HELD ON THE ISSUE OF A COUNTY OR 3 MUNICIPALITY ENTERING INTO CERTAIN LEASE AGREEMENTS; AND FOR 4 RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 31-8-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 31-8-11. Before entering into any lease agreement pursuant to this chapter \* \* \*, the governing authorities of any county or 9 10 municipality shall publish notice of their intention to receive suitable proposals for the leasing of such buildings, facilities 11 or equipment. Such notice shall specify the nature of the 12 proposed building, facility or equipment, the general geographic 13 area in which the same is to be located, the term of the proposed 14 15 lease agreement, if the obligation to pay rentals during the primary term is to be a continuing obligation of and a charge 16 17 against the general credit and leasing power of the county or municipality, and the date and hour on or before which such 18 19 proposals may be received. Such notice shall be published by 20 municipalities and counties in the same manner as required for publishing notice of intention to issue general obligation bonds 21 of the county or municipality, as appropriate. \* \* \* An election 22 23 shall be called by the county in the same manner as provided for the issuance of county general obligation bonds in Sections 24 25 19-9-11 through 19-9-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, or by a municipality in the same manner as provided for the issuance of 26 27 municipal general obligation bonds in Sections 21-33-307 through

H. B. No. 982 00\HR07\R1487 PAGE 1 28 21-33-311, Mississippi Code of 1972, to determine whether or not 29 the proposed lease agreement may be executed by the county or 30 municipality. The lease agreement shall be advertised for competitive sealed proposals once each week for two (2) 31 32 consecutive weeks in a regular newspaper published or having a general circulation in the county or municipality of the governing 33 34 authority. The date as published for the proposal opening shall be not less than five (5) working days after the last published 35 36 notice. The lease shall be awarded to the person submitting the lowest and best proposal; however, all proposals may be rejected. 37 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 38 and after July 1, 2000. 39
