## HOUSE BILL NO. 1033

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-39, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO SET A LIMIT ON THE ALLOWABLE CATCH OF OYSTERS BY A LICENSED OYSTER BOAT AT FORTY SACKS PER DAY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 1

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 49-15-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 49-15-39. (1) It is unlawful for any person to catch or
- 8 take oysters by means of dredging in any of the waters designated
- 9 as tonging reefs by the commission.
- 10 (2) The commission shall designate certain areas as tonging
- reefs. The commission shall mark the boundaries of the areas 11
- 12 designated by appropriate poles, stakes or buoys of material that
- 13 will not injure watercraft, and the boundaries, when designated by
- the commission, shall be final unless shown to be incorrect by a 14
- proceeding which may be brought by any person interested in the 15
- chancery court of the county adjacent to the area. 16
- 17 (3) If any boat or vessel catches or takes oysters by means
- of dredges, drags or scoops, other than hand tongs, from any of 18
- the areas described in this section, or with a dredge or dredges 19
- 20 in the water, then all oysters on board the boat or vessel are
- hereby declared to be contraband and shall be taken and 2.1
- 22 confiscated by the department or any marine law enforcement
- officer without court procedure. The captain and crew of the boat 23
- or vessel, promptly upon being ordered so to do, shall transport 24
- 25 the oysters to a point on the public reefs of the state where the
- 2.6 boat or vessel is found and there scatter the oysters according to

- 27 the instructions of the enforcement officers. Any person who
- 28 violates this section shall be punished as provided in Section
- 29 49-15-63.
- 30 (4) The limits on the allowable catch of oysters by any boat
- 31 or vessel that is licensed to catch, take, carry or transport
- 32 oysters from state reefs is forty (40) sacks per day. In
- 33 <u>calculating the allowable catch, oysters found on any skiffs or</u>
- 34 boats being towed behind the licensed boat or vessel shall be
- 35 counted. If the limits on the allowable catch are exceeded, then
- 36 <u>all oysters on board the licensed boat or vessel and on any skiff</u>
- 37 <u>or boat being towed behind such boat or vessel are declared to be</u>
- 38 <u>contraband and shall be taken and confiscated by the department or</u>
- 39 <u>any marine law enforcement officer without court procedure.</u>
- 40 The captain and crew of any licensed boat or vessel found in
- 41 violation of this subsection, promptly upon being ordered to do
- 42 so, shall transport the oysters to a point on the public reefs of
- 43 the state and scatter the oysters according to the instructions of
- 44 the enforcement officers. Any person who violates this subsection
- 45 shall be punished as provided in Section 49-15-63.
- 46 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 47 and after July 1, 2000.
