HOUSE BILL NO. 1039 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-7-321, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE SCHOOL SECURITY PERSONNEL AND EMPLOYEES EXERCISING THE 3 POWERS OF A PEACE OFFICER TO RECEIVE A MINIMUM LEVEL OF BASIC LAW 4 ENFORCEMENT TRAINING; TO AMEND SECTION 45-6-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 5 1972, TO REQUIRE THE BOARD ON LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER STANDARDS 6 AND TRAINING, ACTING JOINTLY WITH THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION, TO 7 PRESCRIBE THE REQUIRED MINIMUM TRAINING LEVEL FOR SUCH PERSONS; 8 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. Section 37-7-321, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 11 amended as follows:

12 37-7-321. (1) The school board of any school district 13 within the State of Mississippi \* \* \*, in its discretion, <u>may</u> 14 employ one or more persons as security personnel and <u>may</u> designate 15 <u>such persons</u> as peace officers in or on any property operated for 16 school purposes by such board upon <u>their</u> taking such oath and 17 making such bond as required of a constable of <u>the</u> county <u>in which</u> 18 <u>the school district is situated</u>.

19 (2) Any person employed by a school board as a security guard or school resource officer or in any other position that has 20 21 the powers of a peace officer must receive a minimum level of 2.2 basic law enforcement training, as jointly determined and 23 prescribed by the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training and the State Board of Education, within two (2) years of 24 25 the person's initial employment in such position. Upon the 26 failure of any person employed in such position to receive the 27 required training within the designated time, the person may not 28 exercise the powers of a peace officer in or on the property of the school district. 29

No. 1039 00\HR07\R1340CS.1 PAGE 1 30 <u>(3)</u> The school board is authorized and empowered, in its 31 discretion, and subject to the approval of the Federal 32 Communications Commission, to install and operate a noncommercial 33 radio broadcasting and transmission station for educational and 34 vocational educational purposes.

35 SECTION 2. Section 45-6-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 36 amended as follows:

37 45-6-7. In addition to the powers conferred upon the board38 elsewhere in this chapter, the board shall have power to:

39 (a) Promulgate rules and regulations for the
40 administration of this chapter, including the authority to require
41 the submission of reports and information by law enforcement
42 agencies of the state and its political subdivisions.

(b) Establish minimum educational and training
standards for admission to employment or appointment as a law
enforcement officer or a part-time law enforcement officer: (i)
in a permanent position; and (ii) in a probationary status.

47 (c) Certify persons as being qualified under the
48 provisions of this chapter to be law enforcement officers or
49 part-time law enforcement officers.

50 (d) Revoke certification for cause and in the manner51 provided in this chapter.

(e) Establish minimum curriculum requirements for basic
and advanced courses and programs for schools operated by or for
the state or any political subdivision thereof for the specific
purpose of training police and other law enforcement officers,
both full- and part-time.

(f) Consult and cooperate with counties, municipalities, state agencies, other governmental agencies, and with universities, colleges, <u>community and</u> junior colleges and other institutions concerning the development of training schools, programs or courses of instruction for personnel defined in this chapter.

(h) Make such inspection and evaluation as may be
necessary to determine if governmental units are complying with
the provisions of this chapter.

(i) Approve law enforcement officer training schools
for operation by or for the state or any political subdivision
thereof for the specific purpose of training personnel defined in
this chapter.

(j) Upon the request of agencies employing personnel defined in this chapter, conduct surveys or aid municipalities and counties to conduct surveys through qualified public or private agencies and assist in the implementation of any recommendations resulting from such surveys.

(k) Upon request of agencies within the purview of this chapter, conduct general and specific management surveys and studies of the operations of the requesting agencies at no cost to those agencies. The role of the board under this subsection shall be that of management consultant.

82 (1) Adopt and amend regulations consistent with law,83 for its internal management and control of board programs.

84 (m) Enter into contracts or do such things as may be85 necessary and incidental to the administration of this chapter.

86 (n) Establish jointly with the State Board of Education 87 the minimum level of basic law enforcement training required of 88 persons employed by school districts as school security quards, or 89 school resource officers or in other positions that have the 90 powers of a peace officer.

91 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 92 and after July 1, 2000.
