## HOUSE BILL NO. 1112

AN ACT TO CREATE AND EMPOWER THE MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON 1 2 THE ECONOMIC STATUS OF WOMEN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) (a) There is created the Mississippi 5 Commission on the Economic Status of Women. The commission shall be composed of eleven (11) members to be appointed as follows: 6 7 (i) Six (6) members shall be appointed by the 8 Governor; and 9 (ii) Five (5) members shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. 10 (b) The members of the commission shall be women and 11 men of recognized ability and achievement who are representative 12 of the ethnic and cultural diversity of the population of this 13 14 state. Members shall serve for terms of four (4) years each, and no member may serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms. All 15 16 vacancies shall be filled by the appointing authority for the unexpired term. 17 The commission shall elect a chairman, vice 18 (C) 19 chairman and secretary from among its members for terms of two (2) years each, and any member is eligible for successive elections to 20 21 office. A quorum for transacting business shall be a 2.2 (d) 23 majority of the members of the commission. 24 (e) Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for 25 expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41, and shall receive per diem as provided in Section 25-3-69. 26

after he has made his appointments, and the Governor shall then
designate a place and time for the initial, organizational meeting
of the commission.

31 (2) The commission shall have the powers and authority 32 necessary to carry out the duties imposed upon it by this act, 33 including, but not limited to, the following:

34 (a) To employ such administrative, technical and other
35 personnel as may be necessary for the performance of its powers
36 and duties;

37 (b) To hold hearings, make and sign any agreements and
38 do or perform any acts which may be necessary, desirable or proper
39 to carry out the purposes of this act;

40 (c) To cooperate with any state agency, authority, 41 board, commission, department or institution to facilitate its 42 implementation of the powers and duties granted to the commission 43 in this act; and each such state agency, authority, board, 44 commission, department or institution shall cooperate with the 45 commission in the performance of its duties;

(d) To appoint advisers or advisory committees from
time to time when the commission determines that the experience or
expertise of such advisers or advisory committees is needed for
projects of the commission; and

(e) To apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts and services from the state, the government of the United States or any of its agencies, or any other public or private source, for the purpose of defraying clerical and administrative costs as may be necessary in carrying out its duties under this act.

(3) (a) The commission shall study, but not be limited to,the following areas:

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(iii) The development of individual potential; 61 62 (iv) State laws in regard to the civil, economic and political rights of women, including pensions, tax 63 64 requirements, property rights, marriage and dissolution of 65 marriage provisions, and similar matters; 66 (v) The effect of social attitudes and pressures and economic considerations in shaping the roles to be assumed by 67 68 women in the society; and 69 (vi) Any laws, practices or conditions concerning or affecting women which impose special limitations or burdens 70 71 upon them or upon society, or which limit or tend to limit 72 economic opportunities available to women. 73 The commission shall act as an information center (b) on the economic status of women and women's educational, 74 75 employment and other related needs. 76 The commission shall recommend, develop, prepare or (C) 77 coordinate materials, projects or other activities and shall give 78 technical and consultative advice to public or private groups or persons concerned with any of the following: 79 80 (i) Preventing or minimizing problems brought about by the changing roles and responsibilities of women; and 81 82 (ii) Developing programs to encourage and enable women to be fully contributing members of society. 83 84 (d) The commission may encourage women's organizations 85 and other groups to institute local self-help activities designed to meet women's educational, employment and related needs. 86 87 (4) The commission shall make a report to the Legislature at the close of each fiscal year on its activities, findings and 88 89 recommendations. 90 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 91 and after July 1, 2000.

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
