HOUSE BILL NO. 1166

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 69-21-109, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE AGRICULTURAL AVIATION BOARD TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS TO PROHIBIT APPLICATORS AND PILOTS FROM SPRAYING CHEMICALS AND PESTICIDES WITHIN ONE-FOURTH MILE OF A CITY'S CORPORATE LIMITS OR AN INHABITED OR RESIDENTIAL AREA; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 SECTION 1. Section 69-21-109, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 9 amended as follows:

69-21-109. The board, after public hearing duly held, is 10 11 hereby vested with the authority to adopt such rules and regulations as may be necessary to regulate the application of 12 13 chemicals and pesticides according to the time of year, manner, 14 form and area of application, wind velocity, and may restrict the use of certain chemicals and pesticides which create an unusual 15 hazard to the health, safety and welfare of the public. The board 16 shall adopt rules and regulations to prohibit applicators and 17 pilots from spraying chemicals and pesticides within one-fourth 18 19 (1/4) mile of the municipal corporate limits or an inhabited or 20 residential area. The board shall set professional standards for applicators and pilots in the interest of the safety, welfare and 21 general well-being of the public of Mississippi. 22 23

The board shall have authority to procure samples of spray and dust materials before and after they are mixed in order to determine the concentration of the mixtures.

The Agricultural Aviation Board shall have authority to maintain an office and employ necessary personnel within the framework of fees collected to carry out the purposes of this

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30 It shall be the duty of the board to enforce this article and 31 all rules and regulations made and adopted in compliance with this 32 article.

33 The board or its representatives shall have access to any 34 premises where there is reason to believe that a chemical or pesticide is being or has been applied by an applicator, or where 35 any applicator is based, or preparing to apply any of the 36 37 materials herein stated, for the purpose of enforcement of this article. The board shall have authority to inspect equipment used 38 for application of chemicals and pesticides as stated in this 39 article. 40

The Board of Agricultural Aviation shall maintain a close 41 42 liaison and spirit of cooperation with the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, in the supervision of aerially 43 44 applied chemicals which are under their jurisdiction as provided by Sections 69-21-7 through 69-21-15. The board, further, shall 45 closely assist the Mississippi Department of Transportation in 46 carrying out its statutory functions to the end that aviation can 47 48 continue its rapid advance.

49 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from50 and after July 1, 2000.

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
