HOUSE BILL NO. 1176

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-17-509, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE EXCLUSIONS UNDER THE LEAD-BASED PAINT ACTIVITY 3 ACCREDITATION AND CERTIFICATION ACT TO BE CONSISTENT WITH FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 49-17-509, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:[BD1] 8 49-17-509. (1) The commission shall adopt regulations for accreditation of lead-based paint activity training programs. 9 10 Accredited training programs shall ensure the availability of, and provide adequate facilities for, the delivery of lectures, course 11 12 tests, hands-on training and assessment activities. This includes providing training equipment that reflects current work practices 13 and maintaining or updating the equipment and facilities as 14 15 needed. The training program shall offer courses which teach work practice standards for conducting lead-based paint activities as 16 17 adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency or the commission under Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531. These 18 19 standards shall be taught in the appropriate courses to provide 20 trainees with the knowledge needed to perform the lead-based paint activities they are responsible for. The commission also may 21 22 adopt accreditation requirements for training programs providing 23 refresher training programs.

24 (2) The commission shall adopt regulations establishing work 25 practice standards for performing lead-based paint activities in 26 target housing and child-occupied facilities. These standards may include appropriate documented methodologies, clearance levels and 27

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requirements for lead hazard screens, risk assessments, abatement activities, sample collection and analysis and record keeping. Beginning on August 31, 1998, all lead-based paint activities shall be performed in accordance with work practice standards adopted under Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531. The commission shall implement a compliance monitoring program to ensure compliance with the work practice standards.

35 (3) The commission shall adopt regulations for certification
36 of lead-based paint risk assessors, project designers,
37 supervisors, inspectors and workers.

38 (4) Applicants for the issuance or reissuance of certificates required under Sections 49-17-511 through 49-17-519 39 40 shall submit to the commission, on forms prepared by the commission, an application. In addition, the applicant shall 41 42 submit documentation deemed appropriate by the commission providing the educational background and demonstrating 43 44 satisfactory completion of the applicable training programs and 45 shall pay the applicable fee.

46 (5) The commission shall require certificates issued under
47 Sections 49-17-511 through 49-17-521 to be reissued annually.

48 (6) Except as otherwise required by Sections 49-17-501
49 through 49-17-531, regulations adopted under Sections 49-17-501
50 through 49-17-531 shall be no more stringent than federal
51 regulations for lead-based paint activities.

52 (7) Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531 do not apply to a person who is performing lead-based paint activities or abatement 53 54 of lead-based paint hazards in a residential dwelling owned by 55 that person, unless the residential dwelling is occupied by a 56 person or persons other than the owner or owner's immediate family 57 while these activities are being performed, or a child residing in the building has been identified as having an elevated blood lead 58 59 <u>level</u>.

60 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 61 and after its passage.

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
