HOUSE BILL NO. 1187

- AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE ATTENDING PHYSICIAN OF A DECEASED
- 2 PERSON TO SIGN THE DEATH CERTIFICATE FOR THE DECEASED PERSON
- 3 WITHIN TEN DAYS AFTER IT IS PRESENTED TO THE PHYSICIAN; TO PROVIDE
- 4 A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Any physician in charge of the care of a
- 7 deceased person, who is presented a certificate of death for the
- 8 deceased person by the funeral home that handled the funeral
- 9 arrangements for the deceased, the medical examiner or the State
- 10 Department of Health, shall sign the certificate of death within
- 11 ten (10) working days after the certificate is presented to him or
- 12 her, or provide the presenter of the certificate with a
- 13 satisfactory explanation for his or her refusal or inability to
- 14 sign the certificate.
- 15 (2) Any physician who violates the provisions of subsection
- 16 (1) of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
- 17 conviction, shall be fined not more than One Hundred Dollars
- 18 (\$100.00).
- 19 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 20 and after July 1, 2000.
