COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1305

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 31-11-27, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO PREPARE 2 AND FILE AN ANNUAL REPORT WITH THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET OFFICE, THE 3 HOUSE PUBLIC BUILDINGS, GROUNDS AND LANDS COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE 4 5 PUBLIC PROPERTY COMMITTEE DESCRIBING THE PROPOSED FIVE-YEAR 6 CAPITAL NEEDS OF STATE AGENCIES; TO PROVIDE CERTAIN INFORMATION THAT SUCH REPORT MUST CONTAIN; TO PROVIDE THAT STATE CAPITAL 7 IMPROVEMENTS PROJECTS COSTING ONE MILLION DOLLARS OR MORE SHALL BE 8 9 FUNDED BY THE LEGISLATURE IN TWO PHASES; TO DEFINE EACH PHASE; TO 10 PROVIDE THAT EACH PHASE SHALL BE FUNDED IN SEPARATE SESSIONS OF 11 THE LEGISLATURE; TO EXEMPT CERTAIN PROJECTS FROM SUCH REQUIREMENTS; TO REQUIRE ALL STATE AGENCIES WHICH PLAN TO 12 UNDERTAKE A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT TO SUBMIT A PREPLANNED 13 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT PROJECTION TO THE BUREAU OF BUILDING, 14 15 GROUNDS AND REAL PROPERTY MANAGEMENT FOR EVALUATION; TO PROVIDE 16 THAT ANY PROJECT COSTING UNDER ONE MILLION DOLLARS SHALL NOT BE 17 REQUIRED TO BE PREPLANNED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 18

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 31-11-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:[LH1]

31-11-27. (1) (a) The Department of Finance and 22 23 Administration shall conduct a detailed study of the building and 2.4 other capital needs at each state institution and at each junior college immediately prior to September first in each year. This 25 study shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following 26 matters: (i) an inventory of every state building and other 27 28 capital facility which is the property of the State of Mississippi; (ii) the location, date of construction or 29 30 acquisition, the purpose for which used, outstanding indebtedness against such facility, if any, and cost of repairs for the 31 preceding fiscal year; (iii) an examination of the condition of 32 the building or other facility; (iv) an estimate of the cost of 33 34 repairs required to place the facility in good condition; (v) an

35 estimate of the cost of major renovations, if contemplated; and 36 (vi) a determination of the new building and other facility needs 37 of each institution with such needs classified under immediate or 38 long range requirements.

39 (b) All state agencies, departments and institutions 40 are hereby authorized and directed to cooperate with the 41 Department of Finance and Administration in carrying out the 42 provisions of this section.

43 (c) The Department of Finance and Administration shall 44 submit a detailed report to the Legislative Budget Office on or 45 before September first of each year. Such report shall be in such 46 detail and in such form as may be prescribed by the Legislative 47 Budget Office.

(d) The architect or building inspector of the 48 49 Department of Finance and Administration shall make a biennial 50 inspection of the New Capitol, Old Capitol, Woolfolk State Office 51 Building, War Memorial Building, the Governor's Mansion, and all 52 other buildings under jurisdiction of the Department of Finance 53 and Administration for structural or other physical needs or 54 defects of such buildings, and he shall further inquire of the 55 department or its representatives regarding the condition of the buildings. He shall make a written report of his finding to the 56 57 Department of Finance and Administration, Governor, Lieutenant 58 Governor and Speaker of the House of Representatives. The report shall also make recommendations for repairs and list, by number, 59 60 the priority which should be given to making necessary repairs. (2) (a) In addition to any report required in subsection 61 62 (1) of this section, the Department of Finance and Administration shall prepare and submit an annual report to the Legislative 63 Budget Office, the House Public Buildings, Grounds and Lands 64 65 Committee and the Senate Public Property Committee describing the 66 proposed capital improvements projects for state agencies,

departments and institutions for the upcoming five-year period. 67 68 The Department of Finance and Administration shall not be required to include in the report any project costing less than One Million 69 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). The department shall submit the report 70 71 before September 1 of each year. The report shall include at 72 least the following information: 73 (i) A prioritized list of the projects proposed 74 for the five-year period, with each project ranked on the basis of 75 need; 76 (ii) A prioritized list of the projects proposed 77 for the next regular legislative session, with each project ranked 78 on the basis of need; 79 (iii) A prioritized list of the projects requested 80 by each state agency, department or institution; 81 (iv) A detailed explanation of criteria used by the Department of Finance and Administration to rank projects for 82 purposes of any list it prepares under this paragraph (a); 83 84 (v) A detailed statement of justification for each 85 <u>project;</u> 86 (vi) The approximate cost for each project, 87 including, but not limited to, itemized estimates of costs for preplanning, constructing, furnishing and equipping a project, and 88 89 costs for property acquisition; 90 (vii) The estimated beginning date and completion 91 date for each project; 92 (viii) Whether a project, as proposed, is a 93 complete project or a phase or part of a project; (ix) How a project will affect the operating 94 95 budget of the applicable agency, department or institution for the 96 upcoming five-year period, regarding such items as additional 97 personnel requirements, utility costs, maintenance costs, security <u>costs, etc.;</u> 98 99 (x) The proposed method of financing each project

and the effect such financing will have on the state budget, including an estimate of any required debt service for the 101 102 project, and an estimate of any federal funds or other funds that 103 the agency, department or institution may have access to because 104 of the project; and 105 (xi) A list of the projects requested by each agency, department or institution for the five-year period, with 106 each project ranked by the appropriate agency, department or 107 institution on the basis of need. 108 109 (b) To enable the Department of Finance and 110 Administration to prepare the report required in this subsection 111 (2), it may require all state agencies, departments and institutions to file a capital improvements projects request with 112 such information and in such form and in such detail as the 113 department may deem necessary and advisable. Such request shall 114 be filed with the Department of Finance and Administration no 115 later than August 1 of each year. 116 SECTION 2. (1) Every capital improvements project, costing 117 118 One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) or more, which is developed to 119 repair, renovate, construct, remodel, add to or improve a 120 state-owned public building shall be funded by the Legislature in two (2) phases. The two-phase funding requirement shall not apply 121 122 to capital improvements projects for a state-owned port or where 123 the Legislature finds that an emergency or critical need must be met or a court order complied with. The two (2) phases shall not 124 125 be funded in the same regular session of the Legislature. Each 126 phase shall be funded in a separate session of the Legislature. 127 Phase 1 shall be a preplanned capital improvements project budget projection for the project and shall be funded first. Phase 2 128 shall be the actual repair, renovation, construction, remodeling, 129 130 addition to or improvement of the state-owned public building and 131 the acquisition of furniture and equipment for the capital

132 improvements project and shall be funded second.

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133 (2) For the purposes of this section, the term "preplanned" 134 or "preplanning" means the preliminary planning that establishes 135 the program, scope, design and budget for a capital improvements 136 project.

137 (3) Every state agency that plans to repair, renovate, construct, remodel, add to or improve a state-owned public 138 139 building shall submit a preplanned capital improvements project budget projection to the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real 140 Property Management for evaluation. The bureau shall assess the 141 142 need for all preplanned projects submitted and shall compile a 143 report on its findings. Any capital improvements project costing less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall not be 144 required to be preplanned. 145

146 (4) Upon the completion of any preplanning for a capital
147 improvements project, if such preplanning is funded with
148 self-generated funds by a state agency, the plan shall be
149 submitted to the bureau for evaluation.

150 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 151 and after July 1, 2000.
