HOUSE BILL NO. 1307

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-11-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO DIRECT THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO PROMULGATE RULES AND 3 REGULATIONS TO ALLOW PERSONS RESIDING IN A PERSONAL CARE HOME TO 4 "AGE IN PLACE"; TO DEFINE AGE IN PLACE AS ALLOWING A PERSON TO 5 CONTINUE RESIDING IN A PERSONAL CARE HOME AS THE PERSON AGES AND THE PERSON'S NEEDS CHANGE OVER TIME, AS LONG AS THE PERSON IS STILL ABLE TO RECEIVE THE CARE THAT HE OR SHE NEEDS WHILE RESIDING б 7 8 IN THE PERSONAL CARE HOME; TO PROVIDE THAT THE AGE IN PLACE REGULATIONS WILL BE SUBJECT TO STATE LAWS, LOCAL ORDINANCES AND 9 10 RULES, REGULATIONS AND MINIMUM STANDARDS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD 11 RELATIVE TO FIRE PROTECTION MEASURES AND LIFE SAFETY CODES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 43-11-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:[RF1]

16 43-11-13. (1) The licensing agency shall adopt, amend, promulgate and enforce such rules, regulations and standards, 17 including classifications, with respect to all institutions for 18 19 the aged or infirm to be licensed hereunder as may be designed to 20 further the accomplishment of the purpose of this chapter in 21 promoting adequate care of individuals in such institutions in the interest of public health, safety and welfare. Such rules, 22 23 regulations and standards shall be adopted and promulgated by the 24 licensing agency and shall be recorded and indexed in a book to be 25 maintained by the licensing agency in its main office in the State 26 of Mississippi, entitled "Rules, Regulations and Minimum Standards for Institutions for the Aged or Infirm" and the book shall be 27 28 open and available to all institutions for the aged or infirm and 29 the public generally at all reasonable times. Upon the adoption 30 of such rules, regulations and standards, the licensing agency shall mail copies thereof to all such institutions in the state 31

No. 1307 00\HR40\R1689 PAGE 1 which have filed with <u>the</u> agency their names and addresses for this purpose, but the failure to mail the same or the failure of the institutions to receive the same shall in nowise affect the validity thereof. <u>Those</u> rules, regulations and standards may be amended by the licensing agency from time to time as necessary to promote the health, safety and welfare of persons living in <u>those</u> institutions.

39 (2) The licensee shall keep posted in a conspicuous place on 40 the licensed premises all current rules, regulations and minimum standards applicable to fire protection measures as adopted by the 41 licensing agency. The licensee shall furnish to the licensing 42 agency at least once each six (6) months a certificate of approval 43 44 and inspection by state or local fire authorities. Failure to comply with state laws and/or municipal ordinances and current 45 46 rules, regulations and minimum standards as adopted by the licensing agency, relative to fire prevention measures, shall be 47 prima facie evidence for revocation of license. 48

(3) The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules and 49 50 regulations restricting the storage, quantity and classes of drugs 51 allowed in personal care homes. Residents requiring 52 administration of Schedule II Narcotics as defined in the Uniform 53 Controlled Substances Law may be admitted to a personal care home. 54 Schedule drugs may only be allowed in a personal care home if 55 they are administered or stored utilizing proper procedures under 56 the direct supervision of a licensed physician or nurse.

(4) The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules and 57 58 regulations to allow persons residing in a personal care home to 59 "age in place" to the greatest extent possible. "Age in place" means that a person will be allowed to continue residing in the 60 61 personal care home as the person ages and the person's needs change over time, up until the person's death, if the person or 62 the person's family wishes for the person to do so, and as long as 63 the person is still able to receive the care that he or she needs 64 while residing in the personal care home. The determination about 65 66 whether the person is able to receive needed care while residing in the personal care home will be made by the personal care home 67 operator, subject to any final determination made by the licensing 68

The age in place rules and regulations will be subject to state laws, municipal ordinances and rules, regulations and 70 71 minimum standards adopted by the licensing agency relative to fire protection measures and life safety codes. If allowing a person 72 73 to continue residing in a personal care home would cause the home 74 to be in violation of any fire protection measures or life safety codes, then that person will not be allowed to remain in the 75 personal care home under the age in place rules and regulations. 76 77 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 78 and after July 1, 2000.
