HOUSE BILL NO. 1328

1 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE MISSISSIPPI COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR 2 COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS MAINTAINING A 3.00 GRADE 3 POINT AVERAGE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is established the Mississippi
Community and Junior College Scholarship Program for eligible
students enrolled in the state-supported community and junior
colleges of this state.

9 The tuition of any full-time student who is enrolled in (2) 10 a state-supported community or junior college in the State of Mississippi who has a cumulative grade point average of at least 11 12 3.00 calculated on a 4.00 scale upon completion of no less than 13 twelve (12) semester hours during the student's first semester shall be paid by the state on behalf of the student. The maximum 14 award that may be made under this scholarship program may not 15 exceed the cost of tuition at the community or junior college in 16 which the student is enrolled. Students may receive awards for a 17 maximum of three (3) semesters. However, a student may not 18 receive awards under this program for greater than sixty-three 19 20 (63) semester hours, and any student who has completed an associate or baccalaureate degree is not eligible to participate 21 22 in the program. Scholarships awarded to nonresidents of the state may not include any out-of-state tuition assessed by the community 23 or junior college. For purposes of this section, "tuition" means 24 25 the semester charges and all required fees imposed by a community or junior college as a condition of enrollment. 26

No. 1328 00\HR12\R1695 PAGE 1 27 (3)As a condition for renewal of a scholarship, a student 28 must maintain continuous enrollment in a community or junior 29 college and must make steady academic progress toward a certificate or associate degree, as certified by the community or 30 31 junior college's registrar. However, the State Board for 32 Community and Junior Colleges may grant an exception to the 33 requirement for continuous enrollment in order to allow a student to participate in a cooperative, internship or foreign study 34 35 Scholarship recipients must maintain a cumulative grade program. point average of at least 3.00 calculated on a 4.00 scale on all 36 coursework completed. Eligibility for renewal of a scholarship 37 38 shall be evaluated at the end of each semester.

39 (4) The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall 40 be the administering agency of this scholarship program and shall 41 promulgate rules and regulations necessary to carry out the 42 purposes and intent of this section.

(5) Scholarship payments under the Mississippi Community and Junior College Scholarship Program shall be payable to the recipient and the community or junior college in which the student is enrolled and shall be mailed directly to the community or junior college.

It is the intent of the Legislature to fully fund 48 (6) 49 scholarships to eligible students under this program. If funds 50 are insufficient to fully fund scholarships to all eligible applicants, the board shall award the scholarships to first-time 51 52 students on a first-come, first-served basis; however, priority 53 consideration must be given to persons previously receiving awards 54 under the program who are making steady academic progress toward completion of a certificate program or associate degree. 55

56 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 57 and after July 1, 2000.

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
