## HOUSE BILL NO. 1373

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-4-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO DONATE, TRANSFER OR SELL CERTAIN LANDS OWNED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO THE MISSISSIPPI ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT CENTER; TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT CENTER; TO PROVIDE THAT THE CENTER SHALL BE ADMINISTERED BY THE MISSISSIPPI ARTS COMMISSION; TO AMEND SECTION 39-11-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; TO AMEND SECTION 39-11-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO AND TO CREATE A SPECIAL FUND FOR THE CENTER, MONIES IN WHICH SHALL BE USED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE CENTER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
13	SECTION 1. Section 49-4-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
14	amended as follows:[HS1]
15	49-4-9. Effective July 1, 1979, the Department of Wildlife,
16	Fisheries and Parks shall have the following powers and duties:
17	(a) To formulate the policy of the department regarding
18	wildlife and fisheries within the jurisdiction of the department;
19	(b) To apply for, receive and expend any federal or
20	state funds or contributions, gifts, devises, bequests or funds
21	from any other source;
22	(c) To commission or conduct studies designed to
23	determine alternative methods of managing and conserving the
24	wildlife and fisheries resources of this state in a manner to
25	insure efficiency and sustained productivity;
26	(d) To receive the advice and counsel of the advisory
27	committees created for the Division of Parks and Recreation and

(e) To donate, transfer or sell lands owned by the

department in the City of Jackson to the Mississippi Arts and

the Division of Wildlife and Fisheries; \* \* \*

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- 31 Entertainment Center created in Section 2 of this act; and
- 32 <u>(f)</u> To discharge such other duties, responsibilities
- 33 and powers as are necessary to implement the provisions of this
- 34 chapter.
- 35 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) There is created the Mississippi Arts and
- 36 Entertainment Center located in Jackson, Mississippi. The purpose
- 37 of the center shall be to provide an educational, entertaining and
- 38 interactive facility to illustrate the unique culture of the State
- 39 of Mississippi; to illustrate the outstanding contributions of
- 40 Mississippians to the arts and the field of entertainment; and to
- 41 provide family-oriented attractions in the delivery of an
- 42 educational experience to citizens of, and visitors to,
- 43 Mississippi.
- 44 (2) The Mississippi Arts and Entertainment Center shall
- 45 consist of a conference center, a performing arts theater, an
- 46 amphitheater and an artists' village. The center shall conduct
- 47 ongoing events such as induction into an arts and entertainment
- 48 hall of fame, seminars, workshops and demonstrations by guest
- 49 artists.
- 50 (3) The center shall be administered by the Mississippi Arts
- 51 Commission. Subject to the availability of funding appropriated
- 52 therefor, the commission may hire a director of the center, who
- 53 shall serve at the will and pleasure of the commission. The
- 54 director shall administer the center in accordance with the
- 55 policies established by the commission.
- 56 (4) For the construction, operation and support of the
- 57 center, the commission may receive contributions, donations of
- 158 land or other property, gifts, bequests of money, other forms of
- 59 financial assistance and property, equipment, materials or
- 60 manpower from persons, foundations, trust funds, corporations,
- organizations and other sources, public or private, to be expended
- 62 and utilized by the commission in carrying out the mission of the
- 63 center.

- (5) All expenditures for the center shall be paid by the
- 65 State Treasurer on warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer,
- 66 and he shall issue his warrants upon requisition signed by the
- 67 director of the center and the chairman of the commission.
- SECTION 3. Section 39-11-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 69 amended as follows:[HS2]
- 70 39-11-7. The duties and objectives of the commission shall
- 71 be:
- 72 <u>(a)</u> To stimulate and encourage throughout the state the
- 73 study and presentation of the performing, visual, and literary
- 74 arts and public interest and participation therein;
- 75 (b) To encourage participation in, appreciation of, and
- 76 education in the arts to meet the legitimate needs and aspirations
- 77 of persons in all parts of the state;
- 78 (c) To take such steps as may be necessary and
- 79 appropriate, to encourage public interest in the cultural heritage
- 80 of Mississippi, to expand the state's cultural resources, and to
- 81 promote the use of art in the state government's activities and
- 82 facilities; \* \* \*
- 83 (d) To encourage excellence and assist freedom of
- 84 artistic expression essential for the well-being of the arts; and
- 85 (e) To administer the Mississippi Arts and
- 86 Entertainment Center and to acquire land and property in order to
- 87 construct and administer the center.
- SECTION 4. Section 39-11-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 89 amended as follows:[HS3]
- 90 39-11-9. (1) The Mississippi Arts Commission is authorized
- 91 and empowered to hold public hearings, to enter into contracts
- 92 within the limit of funds available therefor, with individuals,
- 93 organizations and institutions for services furthering the
- 94 objectives of the commission's programs; to enter into contracts,
- 95 within the limit of funds available therefor, with local and
- 96 regional associations for cooperative endeavors furthering the

97 objectives of the commission's programs; to accept gifts, 98 contributions and bequests of unrestricted funds from individuals, 99 foundations, corporations and other organizations or institutions for the purpose of furthering the objectives of the commission's 100 101 programs; to make and sign any agreements and to do and perform 102 any acts that may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this 103 chapter. The commission may request and shall receive from any 104 department, division, board, bureau, commission or agency of the 105 state such assistance and data as will enable it properly to carry 106 out its powers and duties hereunder.

(2) Any private donations, bequests or private foundation grants to the Mississippi Arts Commission, other than those <u>designated to benefit the Mississippi Arts and Entertainment</u> Center, shall be deposited into the Mississippi Fund for the Arts, a special fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. All funds deposited in this fund shall be used exclusively for the objectives of the commission as herein provided. Funds deposited into the Mississippi Fund for the Arts may be disbursed by the Mississippi Arts Commission in accordance with the terms of the bequest or grant and in compliance with the purposes and policies of the Mississippi Arts Commission. Any disbursements made from the fund shall be authorized by both the chairman and the executive director of the commission and shall be supported by official actions and votes spread upon the minutes of the commission at an open public meeting. Any unexpended balance in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund and may be expended by the commissioner in subsequent fiscal years. Any interest earned on the fund may remain in the fund for disbursement by the commission in compliance with its purposes and policies. All transactions of the fund shall be reported annually to appropriate state agencies and subject to audit by the State Auditor and by auditors of donors. The Mississippi Fund for the Arts shall not be used for

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- 130 grants from federal agencies, including, but not limited to, the
- 131 National Endowment for the Arts.
- 132 (3) Any monies made available by legislative appropriation
- or bond issuance, public or private transfers of property, public
- 134 <u>or private donations or bequests, public or private foundation</u>
- grants for the benefit of the Mississippi Arts and Entertainment
- 136 Center shall be deposited into the Mississippi Fund for the Arts
- 137 and Entertainment Center, a special fund which is created in the
- 138 State Treasury. All funds deposited in this fund shall be used
- 139 exclusively for the construction and administration of the
- 140 Mississippi Arts and Entertainment Center. Unexpended amounts
- 141 remaining in the special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall
- 142 not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on
- 143 <u>amounts in the special fund shall be deposited to the credit of</u>
- 144 the special fund.
- 145 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 146 and after July 1, 2000.
