HOUSE BILL NO. 1416

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT AN ELECTED PUBLIC OFFICIAL AND CERTAIN APPOINTED PUBLIC OFFICIALS MAY NOT QUALIFY AS A CANDIDATE FOR ANOTHER ELECTIVE PUBLIC OFFICE UNLESS HE RESIGNS FROM THE OFFICE 2 3 THAT HE CURRENTLY HOLDS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. A person who holds an elective public office, 7 whether state, county, district or municipal, or an appointed office for a definite term, whether state, county, district or 8 municipal may not qualify as a candidate for a different elective 9 10 public office, unless he resigns from the office that he holds not later than the earlier of (a) the date on which he would otherwise 11 qualify for the other office that he intends to seek; or (b) the 12 13 date he accepts or consents to the acceptance by another person of a contribution, as defined in Section 23-15-801, to be used for 14 15 his benefit in seeking election to the different office. The resignation shall be executed by the official in writing, 16 17 irrevocably resigning from the office that he holds, and shall be directed and presented to: the Governor, in the case of a state 18 or multicounty district official; to the county board of 19 20 supervisors, in the case of a county official; to the municipal governing authority, in the case of a municipal official; and to 21 the Lieutenant Governor, in the case where the Governor resigns. 22 Any resignation shall create a vacancy in the office, and the 23 24 vacancy shall be filled in the manner provided by law. 25 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 26 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,

or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the

- 28 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 29 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 30 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 31 extended.
- 32 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 33 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 34 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
