HOUSE BILL NO. 1496

AN ACT TO CREATE A NEW CODE SECTION THAT RESTRICTS THE 1 2 OPERATION OF UNMUFFLED AIRBOATS, PROVIDES THAT MUFFLED AIRBOATS 3 CAN ONLY BE OPERATED IN COMMON AREAS AND PROHIBITS CERTAIN BOATS 4 FROM BEING OPERATED IN COASTAL PRESERVES; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES. б BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to 8 operate an unmuffled airboat producing sounds that can be heard five hundred (500) feet or more from the shore on any of the 9 10 waters of this state, unless being operated to request emergency 11 assistance or to warn of a hazardous situation. (2) A muffled airboat that is producing sounds that can be 12 13 heard three hundred (300) feet or more from the shore can only 14 operate in the common areas of this state. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate airboats, 15 (3)aircraft, personal water craft, hover craft or marsh buggies on 16 any publicly owned and managed vegetated wetlands inside the 17 coastal preserves. 18 (4) As used in this section, the following terms shall have 19 the meanings ascribed in this subsection: 20 21 (a) "Common areas" mean navigable waters of this state. "Operate" means to navigate or otherwise use a 22 (b) motorboat or vessel. 23 "Waters of this state" mean any waters within the 24 (C)25 territorial limits of this state and the marginal sea adjacent to this state and the high seas when navigated as a part of a journey 26 27 or ride to or from the shore of the state; however, "waters of

H. B. No. 1496 00\HR40\R995.1 PAGE 1 this state" does not mean any private pond or lake which is not used for boat rentals or the charging of fees for fishing therein. (d) "Personal water craft" means a vessel having an inboard motor that powers a water jet pump as the primary source of propulsion and is designed to be operated by a person sitting, standing, kneeling on, or being towed behind the vessel.

34 (5) A person violating this section is guilty of a
35 misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of
36 not less that One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more that Five
37 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

38 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this act shall be codified in 39 Chapter 27, Title 49, Mississippi Code of 1972.

40 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 41 and after July 1, 2000.
