1 2 3 4 5	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-13-107, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION AS A COURT REPORTER SHALL NOT REQUIRE A PHOTOGRAPH; TO AMEND SECTION 9-13-121, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. Section 9-13-107, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
8	amended as follows:[BD1]
9	9-13-107. No person shall be qualified or authorized to
10	report testimony or proceedings relevant to matters under the
11	jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Mississippi, all state
12	agencies or the Legislature or any committee or subcommittee
13	thereof, or where appeal to any court of the State of Mississippi
14	is allowable by law, unless such person satisfies the provisions
15	of Sections 9-13-101 through 9-13-121 with respect to
16	certification. Sections 9-13-101 through 9-13-121 shall not be
17	construed to apply to any proceedings that take place outside the
18	borders of the State of Mississippi.
19	Every applicant for examination for certification as a
20	Certified Shorthand Reporter shall file with the person designated
21	by the board a written application in the form prescribed by the
22	board which shall not require a photograph. At the time the
23	application is filed, the applicant shall pay to the board an
24	application fee established by regulation, which fee shall not be
25	subject to withdrawal by the applicant in the event he should

decide not to take the examination or is denied the right to take

the examination. Upon request, the board shall forward to any

- 28 interested person application forms together with the text of this
- 29 chapter and copies of regulations promulgated by the board under
- 30 the provisions of this chapter.
- 31 SECTION 2. Section 9-13-121, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 32 amended as follows:[BD2]
- 33 9-13-121. (1) Any person graduating from a National Court
- 34 Reporters Association approved school, whether in Mississippi or
- 35 out-of-state, after July 2, 1994, with a degree in court reporting
- 36 <u>shall be given certification without examination.</u>
- 37 (2) The Board of Court Reporters shall implement a true
- 38 <u>Certified Shorthand Reporter's (CSR) examination wherein all</u>
- 39 <u>examinees are able to pass each part of said examination in legs</u>
- 40 (one part at a time). The speeds for the CSR examination shall
- 41 be: Q & A: 200 words a minute; Jury Charge: 180 words a minute;
- 42 and Literary: 160 words a minute. All temporary permits shall be
- 43 stayed until the board has provided such an examination.
- 44 (3) Examinations for certification shall be given not less
- 45 than each six (6) months, at a time and place designated by the
- 46 board. Notification of such examinations shall be given each
- 47 applicant in writing not less than thirty (30) days before
- 48 examination date.
- 49 * * *
- 50 (4) * * * If after three (3) consecutive examinations the
- 51 applicant holding the temporary certificate has not qualified for
- 52 certification, the applicant shall be permitted a hearing before
- 53 the board. If the applicant has passed at least two (2) parts of
- 54 the examination, the applicant will be given an extension of not
- 55 more than one (1) year.
- 56 (5) Should any official court reporting position become
- 57 <u>available</u>, such position must be filled only by an actual tested
- 58 <u>applicant.</u>
- 59 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 60 and after July 1, 2000.
