HOUSE BILL NO. 1538 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO REQUIRE CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS ENTERED INTO BY THE 2 BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND 3 STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING TO INCLUDE A PENALTY PROVISION FOR UNTIMELY PERFORMANCE AND WARRANTY PROVISIONS; AND 4 5 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. б BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Each contract entered into by the Board of 8 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning or a state institution of higher learning for a construction, renovation or 9 repair project, regardless of the source of funding used to defray 10 the cost of the project, must include a provision establishing the 11 date by which the project is to be completed and a clause 12 13 requiring the assessment of a penalty for each day that the 14 project is not certified as having been completed, by the party 15 authorized under the contract to make such certification, after the date specified for completion. The terms of the contract must 16 provide that each day that the project is not certified as having 17 been completed is a separate violation of the contract and that 18 the penalty shall be assessed for each day's violation. 19 The amount of the penalty shall be established in the contract. 20 21 (2) Each contract described under subsection (1) of this section must include a provision guaranteeing the quality of the 2.2 23 workmanship of the project and providing detailed warranties for the various, specific components of the project. This provision 2.4 shall include, at a minimum, the period of duration of each 25 warranty, the remedies available if a warranty is breached and 26

appropriate penalties for a breach of warranty under the contract. 27

28 The warranties in the contract must be consistent with or more 29 stringent than the standard warranties used in the particular 30 industry involved.

31 SECTION $\underline{2}$. This act shall take effect and be in force from 32 and after July 1, 2000.
