## HOUSE BILL NO. 1626

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR $2001.$
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001
10	\$ 21,598,870.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001
18	\$ 10,952,423.00.
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
25	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
26	Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.

27	Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall		
28	pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.		
29	Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into		
30	the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such		
31	money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."		
32	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of		
33	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall		
34	be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of		
35	expenditure:

56	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of		
57	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to		
58	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal		
59	Services" for Fiscal Year 2002 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2001		
60	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions		
61	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2002 budget by the		
62	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the		
63	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall		

- 64 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
- 65 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
- 66 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
- 67 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
- 68 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2001 appropriation for "Personal
- 69 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month,
- 70 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken
- 71 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected
- 72 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2001 "Personal Services"
- 73 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 74 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 75 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 76 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 77 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 78 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.
- 79 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 80 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 81 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 82 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 84 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the
- 85 Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds
- 86 generated from the Forest Acreage Tax in an amount not to exceed
- 87 Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00), and with funds
- 88 generated from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites
- 89 an amount not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 90 (\$500,000.00). It is further the intention of the Legislature
- 91 that the State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its
- 92 budget in the Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of
- 93 expenditure, with funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund
- 94 the Forest Resource Development Program in an amount not to exceed
- 95 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). The receipt of these
- 96 funds is hereby authorized and approved, provided such receipts

97	and expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in		
98	accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq. and Section 27-104-1 et		
99	seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.		
100	SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance		
101	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of		
102	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized		
103	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the		
104	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,		
105	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted		
106	performance measures provided below:

129	SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the		

- 130 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate part-time
- 131 positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed
- 132 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of
- 133 funds that become available to the commission. This escalation
- 134 shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the
- 135 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent
- 136 with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used
- 137 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme
- 138 wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day.
- 139 The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds
- 140 shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written
- 141 notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal
- 142 Officer.
- 143 SECTION 7. The Forestry Commission has the authority to
- 144 purchase from the "General Services Adminsitration" Fire Fighter
- 145 Catalog.
- 146 SECTION 8. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 147 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 148 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 149 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 150 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 151 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 152 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 153 and after July 1, 2000.
