The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Soil and Water Conservation Commission for the purpose of defraying the 8 9 administrative expenses of the commission and carrying out the provisions of Section 69-27-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, 10 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending 11 12 June 30, 2001.....\$ 1,000,252.00. 13 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special 14 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Soil and 15 Water Conservation Commission which is comprised of special source 16 funds collected by or otherwise available to the commission, for 17 the purpose of defraying the expenses of the commission for the 18 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001..... 19 20\$ 943,878.00. SECTION 3. 46	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
47	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
48	Services" for Fiscal Year 2002 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2001
49	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
50	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2002 budget by the
51	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the

No. 1632 00\HR05\A497 PAGE 2 60 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected 61 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2001 "Personal Services" 62 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 63 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 64 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 65 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

66 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 67 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 4. The State Soil and Water Conservation Commission is hereby authorized to retain all funds generated from the sale of equipment. Any funds made available from the sale of equipment shall be deposited into the special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Soil and Water Conservation Commission and shall be used solely for the purpose of purchasing equipment.

SECTION 5. The State Soil and Water Conservation Commission is hereby authorized to receive, budget and expend any proceeds derived from the sale of bonds authorized in Section 69-27-331 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972. All expenditures shall be in accordance with conditions provided in Section 69-27-331 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Soil and Water Conservation Commission shall have the authority to escalate its budget and expend funds from any source not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

91 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the 92 intention of the Legislature that Fifty-five Thousand Dollars

(\$55,000.00) be used for the purpose of funding a Beaver Control 93 Cost Share program. The Mississippi Soil and Water Conservation 94 95 Commission shall promulgate rules and regulations for the establishment and operation of the program on a fund matching 96 97 basis with the county unit of government. Funds not expended or encumbered in a county may be transferred to another county during 98 99 the fiscal year. Only those funds specifically appropriated for 100 the Beaver Control Cost Share program shall be used in any such 101 program.

102 SECTION 8. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 103 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 104 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 105 106 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 107 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 108 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from 109 and after July 1, 2000.
