HOUSE BILL NO. 1633

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND
2 MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR
3 THE FISCAL YEAR 2001.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8 maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001
10\$ 15,412,930.00.

11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15 funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16 the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.....
18\$ 40,026,654.00.

19 The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20 above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21 excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to
22 the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
23 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.....\$5,750,000.00.

24 The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the
25 amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it
26 sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and

27 other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside
28 from such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
29 provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
30 as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
31 any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
32 1972.

33 Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
34 expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
35 authorized by law during Fiscal Year 2001.

36 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
37 Section 2 and allocated in Section 5 to the Bureau of Wildlife and
38 Fisheries, funds in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand
39 Three Hundred Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived
40 from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections
41 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose
42 of defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2001.

43 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
44 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
45 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
46 Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty
47 Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of preservation,
48 protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and
49 wildlife of this state.

50 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
51 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
52 be expended for the respective major objects of such divisions:

95 Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of
96 Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one county to another

97 on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on
98 out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.

120 Of the funds authorized to be expended by the Bureau of
121 Fisheries and Wildlife, not more than One Million Three Hundred
122 Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$1,315,000.00) shall be expended by the
123 Bureau of Fisheries and Wildlife to defray the costs of the
124 Division of Parks and Recreation of the Department of Wildlife,
125 Fisheries and Parks.

126 It is the intention of the Legislature that a reasonable
127 number of Conservation Officers, Conservation Officer Supervisors,
128 District Managers, Area Managers, and Lake Managers shall be
129 employed and/or detailed to both temporary and permanent job

130 assignments in areas other than their county of residence.

152 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
153 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
154 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
155 Services" for Fiscal Year 2002 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2001
156 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
157 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2002 budget by the
158 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
159 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
160 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
161 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
162 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure

163 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
164 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2001 appropriation for "Personal
165 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month,
166 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken
167 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected
168 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2001 "Personal Services"
169 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
170 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
171 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
172 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

173 It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive
174 Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may
175 transfer between the various divisions authorized herein both
176 funds and positions not to exceed five percent (5%) of the
177 authorized budgets in the aggregate. The Executive Director of
178 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall submit
179 written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget
180 Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or
181 before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of
182 the transfer.

183 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
184 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

185 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
186 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
187 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
188 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

189 SECTION 6. The board of supervisors of any county or any
190 group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and
191 empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and
192 with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the
193 purpose of creating, improving or restoring public game and fish
194 habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such
195 county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and

196 authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not exceeding One
197 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the general county
198 fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse to the
199 Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost of all
200 surveying and engineering projects incurred by the Department of
201 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto. Such boards of
202 supervisors are further authorized and empowered, in their
203 discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry out the
204 purposes of this act with any other county, the United States
205 Forest Service or any other agency if same should be necessary for
206 the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for such purposes.
207 The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to
208 lease all woodlands now existing on the O'Keefe Division of the
209 Department of Corrections for use of a game preserve and refuge,
210 upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon by
211 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks and the Department
212 of Corrections.

213 SECTION 7. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks
214 is hereby directed to keep an exact accounting of the funds
215 received during each fiscal year by fund and source and an exact
216 accounting of how these funds were expended by fund and
217 program/division. Such information shall be provided to the House
218 and Senate Appropriations Chairmen, Chairman of the House Game and
219 Fish Committee and Chairmen of the Senate Wildlife and Fisheries
220 and Senate Ports and Marine Resources Committee no later than
221 October 1 following the end of the fiscal year.

222 SECTION 8. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks
223 is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Pearl River
224 Valley Water Supply District to provide for financial support of
225 an additional conservation officer on and around the Ross Barnett
226 Reservoir.

227 The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to
228 escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and

229 Parks for this purpose.

230 SECTION 9. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or
231 other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of
232 any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of
233 Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for
234 any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of
235 Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

236 It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles
237 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply
238 with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

239 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
240 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
241 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not
242 to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), that may
243 become available to the department in accordance with the rules
244 and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.
245 None of the funds authorized in this section shall be used to
246 increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and
247 Fringe Benefits."

248 SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
249 of Section 2 and allocated in Section 5 to the Museum of Natural
250 Science, funds in the amount of Four Hundred Fifty Thousand
251 Dollars (\$450,000.00) shall be derived from the Education
252 Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and
253 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of defraying
254 the expenses of the Mississippi Museum of Natural Science for
255 Fiscal Year 2001.

256 SECTION 12. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
257 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
258 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
259 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
260 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
261 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

289 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
290 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
291 Committee for Fiscal Year 2002.

292 SECTION 13. In order to be in compliance with Sections
293 63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be
294 expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay

295 the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees
296 and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the
297 course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold
298 a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.

299 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
300 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
301 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi
302 Department of Economic and Community Development in the amount of
303 Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section
304 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used
305 to defray the cost of constructing a North Mississippi Fish
306 Hatchery.

307 SECTION 15. Of the funds provided herein, the Department of
308 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to pay the following
309 expenses for publications for Fiscal Year 1996:

320 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to pay the following

324 SECTION 19. Of the funds provided herein, the Department of
325 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to pay the following
326 expenses for construction at the Meridian Fish Hatchery for Fiscal
327 Year 1999:

329 SECTION 20. Of the funds provided herein, One Hundred Fifty
330 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is provided to the Department of
331 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the enhancement of marketing of
332 state parks.

333 SECTION 21. Of the funds provided herein, no more than One
334 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided to the
335 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for furnishing and
336 equipping the new administrative office building for the
337 department.

338 SECTION 22. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
339 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
340 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
341 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
342 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
343 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

344 SECTION 23. This act shall take effect and be in force from
345 and after July 1, 2000.
