3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of
7	Human Services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and
8	ending June 30, 2001\$ 93,989,326.00.
9	Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act,
LO	no funds shall be expended to expand, establish or otherwise
L1	prepare for any expansion of the privatization of the Child
L2	Support Program beyond Hinds and Warren Counties.
L3	Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act,
L4	not more than a total of Two Million Four Hundred Thousand Dollars
L5	(\$2,400,000.00) from General Funds and federal matching funds for
L6	those General Funds shall be expended for the direct or indirect
L7	support of the child support privatization program of MAXIMUS,
L8	Inc., in Hinds and Warren Counties. However, any additional funds
L9	generated for the Department of Human Services through a revenue
20	maximization program designed and implemented on behalf of the
21	department may be used by the department to pay additional costs
22	of MAXIMUS in implementing the child support privatization program

268	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
269	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
270	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
271	Services" for Fiscal Year 2002 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2001
272	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
273	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2002 budget by the
274	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
275	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
276	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
277	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
278	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
279	that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
280	cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2001 appropriation for "Personal
281	Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month,
282	the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken
283	action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected
284	annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2001 "Personal Services"
285	appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
286	reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
287	requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
288	such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
289	It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive
290	Director of the Department of Human Services may transfer between
291	the various divisions authorized herein both funds and positions
292	not to exceed five percent (5%) of the receiving division
293	consistent with the provisions of Section 1 of this act. Provided,
294	however, that no county office positions shall be transferred to

295 any regional office or to the state office. The Executive 296 Director of the Department of Human Services shall submit written 297 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the 298 299 fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the transfer. It is further the intention of the Legislature that any 300 301 transfers made under the provisions of this paragraph shall be of 302 an emergency nature and that in no case shall the transfers be 303 made which substantially alter the legislative intent for the 304 various divisions or offices as set forth in the original appropriations made under this act. 305 306 Any transfers within major object of expenditure within each specific budget or escalations shall be made in accordance with 307 308 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law. 309

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be

used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

Unless expressly authorized herein by the Legislature, no funds appropriated to be expended for travel and subsistence shall be expended to pay expenses incurred by more than six (6) employees or other representatives of the agency for attending the same out-of-state conference, seminar or workshop; however, such funds may be expended for expenses incurred by more than six (6) employees or other representatives for attendance at the same conference, seminar or workshop (a) if attendance is required in order to maintain professional certification or licensure, which certification or licensure is required by the employees' job descriptions or by law, or (b) if such expenditure has received the prior written approval of the Department of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Two 326 327 Million Eighty-six Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-three

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328 (\$2,086,683.00) is provided for the support of a contract with the

329 Department of Education, Industrial Training Program for the

- 330 training of TANF clients.
- 331 These funds shall be transferred to the Mississippi
- 332 Department of Education Industrial Training budget and shall be
- 333 expended in accordance with Sections 37-31-103 through 37-31-111,
- 334 Mississippi Code of 1972. Training will be conducted in the areas
- 335 outlined in Section 37-31-103 (2) for TANF recipients. The terms
- 336 and provisions for program operation will be established through a
- 337 nonfinancial agreement between the Mississippi Department of
- 338 Education and the Mississippi Department of Human Services. This
- 339 nonfinancial agreement will be initiated by the Mississippi
- 340 Department of Education, Office of Vocational and Technical
- 341 Education in accordance with current laws, rules and regulations
- 342 as approved by the Mississippi State Board of Education.
- Identification, eligibility, certification, enrollment,
- 344 follow-up, performance standards and sanction liabilities of the
- 345 TANF clients will be the sole responsibility of the Department of
- 346 Human Services.
- 347 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 348 Executive Director of the Department of Human Services shall make
- 349 a complete report to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee and
- 350 the Department of Finance and Administration no later than October
- 351 15, 2000, concerning the distribution of the funds provided in the
- 352 Social Services Block Grant. This report shall contain data from
- 353 the two (2) previous fiscal years for comparison purposes. The
- 354 two previous fiscal years along with new distribution of funds
- 355 shall be presented side by side with a column showing the
- 356 differences between the previous fiscal year and the new
- 357 distribution of funds.
- 358 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 and
- 359 allocated in Section 4 in the Contractual Services major object of
- 360 expenditure of the Division of Child Support Enforcement that are

361 derived from child support collection incentive payments actually

362 received by the state from the federal government that are

363 attributable to child support collections in Hinds and Warren

364 Counties, the Department of Human Services shall make bonus

365 payments to MAXIMUS for child support collection, which shall be

366 calculated as follows:

- 367 (a) At the end of each quarter of Fiscal Year 2001, the
- 368 total amount of child support collections in Hinds and Warren
- 369 Counties for that quarter shall be determined, based on
- 370 collections received on behalf of Hinds and Warren Counties.
- 371 (b) From the amount determined under paragraph (a) for
- 372 each quarter of Fiscal Year 2001, there shall be subtracted the
- 373 total amount of child support collections in Hinds and Warren
- 374 Counties during the same quarter of Fiscal Year 1999, based on
- 375 collections received on behalf of Hinds and Warren Counties.
- 376 (c) The amount determined under paragraph (b) shall be
- 377 reduced by ten percent (10%).
- 378 (d) The resulting amount determined under paragraph (c)
- in any quarter of Fiscal Year 2001, or the amount of child support
- 380 collection incentive payments actually received by the state from
- 381 the federal government that are attributable to child support
- 382 collections in Hinds and Warren Counties during that quarter,
- 383 whichever is less, shall be the amount of the bonus payment made
- 384 to MAXIMUS for that quarter.
- 385 (e) If the amount determined under paragraph (b) is
- 386 zero (0) or less in any quarter of Fiscal Year 2001, then no bonus
- 387 payment shall be made to MAXIMUS for that quarter.
- 388 SECTION 8. If MAXIMUS, Inc., notifies the Department of
- 389 Human Services that the proposed contract modification presented
- 390 to MAXIMUS by the Department of Human Services for Fiscal Year
- 391 2001 is unacceptable, such action shall be deemed to constitute a
- 392 termination of the contract by MAXIMUS, and the Executive Director
- 393 of the Department of Human Services shall immediately request new

394 bids or proposals for the operation of its child support 395 collection programs in Hinds and Warren Counties for Fiscal Year 396 2001 based upon the proposed contract. Such request for proposals 397 and the awarding of any new contract shall be in compliance with 398 applicable public bid requirements. Any contract entered into by 399 the Department of Human Services for the operation of its child support program in Hinds and Warren Counties shall be for a period 400 401 of not more than one (1) year beginning on July 1, 2000. 402 contract shall be awarded to the lowest and best bidder, and if no 403 satisfactory bids are received, then the Executive Director of the 404 Department of Human Services shall have the authority effective 405 July 1, 2000, to transfer an amount not to exceed Six Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$6,600,000.00) from the funds allocated 406 407 to the Contractual Services major object of expenditure of the 408 Division of Child Support Enforcement to any major object of 409 expenditure within the Division of Child Support Enforcement, and 410 to escalate positions not to exceed ninety (90) permanent 411 full-time positions.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Sections 1 and 2, and authorized for expenditure in Section 4, the amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is provided for the support of the Jackson State University -Continuing Education Learning Center.

SECTION 10. None of the funds appropriated under the
provisions of Sections 1 and 2 shall be used to pay any contractor
that is not a successful bidder for genetic paternity testing
services bid by the Department of Human Services.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One
Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be transferred to the
Department of Health, Child Care Licensure Program from the Child
Care Development Fund or other appropriate special fund. These
funds are to be transferred to the Board of Health no later than
July 31, 2000. The Department of Health shall make a complete

427 accounting to the Department of Human Services detailing the uses of these funds in accordance with federal and state regulations. 428 429 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 430 Department of Human Services contract with the Department of 431 Health to operate the School Nurse Teen Pregnancy Prevention Pilot Program as described in House Bill No. 766 of the 1997 Legislative 432 433 Session, in compliance with all applicable TANF federal and state 434 regulations. SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 435 436 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 437 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 438 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 439 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 440 SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from 441 442 and after July 1, 2000, with the exception of Section 8, which 443 shall take effect and be in force from and after the passage of

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this act.
