| 1 2 3 4 | AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2001. |
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| 5 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: |
| 6 | SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be |
| 7 | necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State |
| 8 | Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation Funds, |
| 9 | for the purpose of defraying the administrative expenses of the |
| 10 | Mississippi Department of Transportation for the fiscal year |
| 11 | beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001 |
| 12 | \$ 936,508,743.00. |
| 13 | SECTION 2. The following offices are supported by the funds |
| 14 | appropriated in Section 1: The Office of Administrative Services, |
| 15 | the Office of Highways, the Office of Aeronautics and Rails and |
| 16 | the Office of Enforcement. Of the funds appropriated under the |
| 17 | provisions of Section 1, not more than the amounts set forth below |
| 18 | shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of |
| 19 | expenditure: |

| 36 | With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of |
| 37 | the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to |
| 38 | make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal |
| 39 | Services" for Fiscal Year 2002 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2001 |
| 40 | funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions |
| 41 | are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2002 budget by the |
| 42 | Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the |
| 43 | Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall |
| 44 | determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all |
| 45 | appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this |
| 46 | act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure |
| 47 | that no single personnel action increases this projected annual |
| 48 | cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2001 appropriation for "Personal |
| 49 | Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, |
| 50 | the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken |
| 51 | action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected |
| 52 | annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2001 "Personal Services" |
| 53 | appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which |
| 54 | reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation |
| 55 | requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until |
| 56 | such time as the requirements of this provision are met. |
| 57 | Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with |
| 58 | the terms, conditions and procedures established by law. |
| 59 | No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be |
| 60 | used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are |

- 63 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
- 64 Department of Transportation under the provisions of Section 1 and
- 65 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, the following amounts
- 66 shall be available for expenditure in the program budgets as
- 67 required by Section 27-103-127, Mississippi Code of 1972:

- 73 Aeronautics, Rails and other.....\$ 3,600,000.00
- 74 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
- 75 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, it is the intention of
- 76 the Legislature that One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00)
- 77 shall be transferred to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce
- 78 for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the Fiscal
- 79 Year 2001.
- SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 81 this act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation may expend
- 82 out of these funds such sums as may be necessary to provide
- 83 transportation and transportation related services, including the
- 84 operation or use of buses, vans or other vehicles owned or leased
- 85 by the Mississippi Department of Transportation, in support of the
- 86 annual meeting of the Southern Legislative Conference hosted by
- 87 the State of Mississippi.
- 88 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
- 89 Department of Transportation, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 90 (\$300,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention
- 91 Program.
- 92 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 93 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall have the authority

- 94 to escalate and expend funds from any proceeds arising from
- 95 participation in drug seizure activities not to exceed Fifty
- 96 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).
- 97 SECTION 8. Of the construction funds appropriated in Section
- 98 1 and allocated in Section 2, it is the intention of the
- 99 Legislature that priority shall be given in letting paving
- 100 contracts on grade, drain and bridge projects which have been
- 101 completed for six (6) months or more. This action will not
- 102 prohibit the Department of Transportation from letting paving
- 103 contracts on grade, drain and bridge projects which have been
- 104 completed for less than six (6) months.
- 105 SECTION 9. Of the funds herein appropriated, up to Four
- 106 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) may be used to move
- 107 buildings from property authorized for conveyance in House Bill
- 108 No. 523, Regular Session 2000.
- 109 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 110 Executive Director of the Department of Transportation may
- 111 transfer between the various programs authorized in Section 3
- 112 funds not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the total funds
- 113 authorized in Section 1, except that transfers cannot be made into
- 114 the "Administration and Other Expense Program." The Executive
- 115 Director of the Department of Transportation shall submit written
- 116 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office
- 117 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the
- 118 fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the
- 119 transfer.
- 120 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 121 Department of Transportation be allowed to escalate its budget in
- 122 the "Capital Outlay" major object of expenditure and the
- 123 appropriate corresponding program, with funds generated as a
- 124 result of third party damages an amount not to exceed Two Million
- 125 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00).
- 126 SECTION 12. The Mississippi Department of Transportation is

- 127 hereby authorized and directed to conduct a pilot maintenance
- 128 project on U. S. Highway 78 between the Tennessee and Alabama
- 129 state lines that is projected to save the department monies over a
- 130 five-year period.
- SECTION 13. Of the funds herein appropriated, funds in the
- amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) are provided
- 133 to construct turn lanes to Highway 145 to improve safety and
- 134 accessibility to Saltillo High School at Saltillo.
- 135 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 136 Department of Transportation be allowed to escalate its budget in
- 137 either the "Capital Outlay" or "Commodities" major object of
- 138 expenditure and the Maintenance Program, with funds which were
- 139 obligated in Fiscal Year 2000 for maintenance overlay projects and
- 140 maintenance repair projects but not completed before the end of
- 141 the Fiscal Year 2000.
- 142 SECTION 15. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 143 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money not expended
- 144 in Fiscal Year 2000 by the Department of Transportation in the
- 145 equipment category for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and
- 146 ending June 30, 2001.....\$ 1,100,000.00.
- 147 SECTION 16. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 148 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 149 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 150 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 151 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 152 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 153 SECTION 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 154 and after July 1, 2000.
