## HOUSE BILL NO. 1671 (As Passed the House)

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, TO OPERATE 2 ITS WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM OUTSIDE THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE 3 CITY OF IUKA WITHIN TISHOMINGO COUNTY; TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY OF 4 IUKA TO ACQUIRE AND ASSUME THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE 5 HARMONY CENTRAL WATER ASSOCIATION AND TO ASSUME ALL THE 6 LIABILITIES, OBLIGATIONS, ASSETS, DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF 7 SUCH ASSOCIATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding any provisions of Section 21-27-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the contrary, the governing 10 authorities of the City of Iuka, Mississippi, in their discretion, 11 may construct, expand, operate and maintain the water distribution 12 system of the City of Iuka within any area in Tishomingo County 13 14 greater than one (1) mile outside the corporate limits of the City 15 of Iuka not certificated to another water utility for such service or if certificated, upon obtaining a release of the Certificate of 16 Public Convenience and Necessity from that utility and obtaining 17 the appropriate Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity 18 from the Public Service Commission. Whenever such water service 19 20 is furnished to any consumer residing outside the corporate limits of the City of Iuka, the consumer may not be charged at a rate 21 22 greater than twice the rate charged for the same service within the corporate limits of the City of Iuka. 23

(2) In connection with the construction, expansion,
operation and maintenance of its water distribution system within
the area authorized under subsection (1) of this section, the
governing authorities of the City of Iuka may acquire the Harmony
Central Water Association and assume the operation and maintenance

No. 1671 00\HR07\R1971 PAGE 1 of the Harmony Central Water Association; and, in connection therewith, such governing authorities may assume all liabilities, obligations, assets, duties and responsibilities of such association. The city shall have such powers and authority concerning the association and its facilities as is now or hereafter granted by law to municipalities concerning water distribution systems.

36 (3) The authority conferred by this act shall not be
37 construed as an exemption from the provisions of Chapter 3, Title
38 77, Mississippi Code of 1972, as to the requirements of obtaining
39 a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, the
40 jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission to regulate rates or
41 any other provision of that law.

42 (4) The governing authorities of the City of Iuka shall make 43 a reasonable effort to provide service to everyone within the 44 water distribution system existing on the effective date of this 45 act who requests such service. For the purpose of this 46 subsection, the term "system" means all areas that are being 47 served by the Harmony Central Water Association on the effective 48 date of this act.

49 (5) The governing authorities of the City of Iuka shall have 50 a financial report on the water distribution system filed annually 51 with the State Auditor for his review. The audited financial 52 statements shall be maintained in the office of the system for 53 public inspection and shall be made available to the public during 54 normal business hours.

55 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 56 and after its passage.
