## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 15 (As Adopted by House)

1 2	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF TUPELO, MISSISSIPPI, ON ITS 100TH ANNIVERSARY.
3	WHEREAS, the First United Methodist Church of Tupelo,
4	Mississippi, the oldest church building in Tupelo and the oldest
5	brick structure of any kind in the city, was officially organized
б	in 1867, the year that Tupelo was incorporated, and met for three
7	years in a frame building which it shared with a Baptist
8	congregation; and
9	WHEREAS, in 1870, a small white frame church was built which
10	served the congregation for thirty years; and, in 1890, Reverend
11	N. G. Augustus was appointed full-time pastor; and
12	WHEREAS, by the mid-1890's, the church needed a larger
13	building to accommodate the growing congregation; and, in 1898,
14	the present property on Main Street was acquired from Thomas J.
15	Babb for \$1,000.00 and paid for with a sack of gold coins; and
16	WHEREAS, in 1898, a building contract was negotiated with Mr.
17	John Stinson of Columbus to build a new church at a cost of
18	\$4,900.00, and the church was officially dedicated on October 3,
19	1903, in a service conducted by Bishop Warren A. Candler of
20	Atlanta; and
21	WHEREAS, following a recent renovation, an official of the

No. 15 00\HR03\R930 PAGE 1 22 Mississippi Department of Archives and History stated that the 23 First United Methodist Church of Tupelo was the best example of a 24 church renovation which was faithful to its original structure 25 that he had ever seen, and the congregation was justifiably proud 26 when the church building was named to the National Registry of 27 Historic Places; and

28 WHEREAS, for one hundred years the church's twenty-nine 29 pastors have proclaimed the Gospel of God's grace over ten 30 thousand times from the pulpit of this church building and have 31 rejoiced in hearing the enthusiastic voices of its members sing 32 the great hymns of faith; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Larry Goodpastor, the present senior minister, 33 34 and the seventeen hundred members of the First United Methodist 35 Church of Tupelo, are proud to have preserved the church's past as represented in this historic building. But they are even more 36 37 pleased to be entrusted with the continuing work of the Kingdom of God as they faithfully face the church's future in a growing and 38 vibrant community; "Rise up, ye saints of God, have done with 39 40 lesser things; give heart and soul and mind and strength to serve the King of Kings!"; and 41

42 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Legislature to recognize and commend excellence, especially when evidenced by the faithful 43 44 devotion of Mississippians united together in their Christian beliefs and traditions through 100 years of growth and prosperity: 45 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 46 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING 47 48 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend and congratulate the First 49 United Methodist Church of Tupelo, Mississippi, on the celebration 50 of its 100th anniversary and extend our heartiest wishes to the 51 church and its parishioners for many more years of spiritual 52 growth and success.
