- 7 WHEREAS, Robert Abraham Greenlee, the Director of the
- 8 Legislative Budget Office, recently retired from Mississippi State
- 9 Government after 39 years of service; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee was born on October 8, 1936, in
- 11 Jackson, Mississippi, and was the son of the late Maggie and
- 12 Robert Greenlee of Hermanville, Mississippi; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee graduated from Port Gibson High
- 14 School in 1954 and furthered his education at the University of
- 15 Mississippi where he was a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon
- 16 Fraternity and where he received a bachelor of science degree in
- 17 business administration in 1959; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee began his interest in state
- 19 government while still in college, serving as a driver for
- 20 Fielding Wright during Wright's 1955 campaign for his second term
- 21 as Governor; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee, upon his graduation from the
- 23 University of Mississippi, worked in the Ross Barnett
- 24 gubernatorial campaign and later served as a Colonel on Governor
- 25 Ross Barnett's staff; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee began work at the Commission of
- 27 Budget and Accounting in January 1960 during the administration of
- 28 Governor Ross Barnett and continued his career there until April

- 29 1965, at which time he moved from Jackson to Port Gibson to serve
- 30 as Assistant Plant Comptroller for Allied Chemical Company and
- 31 subsequently Oliver Electric Company; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee returned to work at the Commission
- 33 of Budget and Accounting in 1968 as chief accountant and in 1973
- 34 was promoted to deputy director and went on to work a total of 23
- 35 years for the Commission of Budget and Accounting; and
- 36 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee continued his service to the
- 37 Legislature upon the abolishment of the Commission of Budget and
- 38 Accounting in July 1984 by accepting the position of Fiscal
- 39 Control Officer with the newly created Joint Legislative Budget
- 40 Committee and Legislative Budget Office; and
- 41 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee was promoted to Director of the
- 42 Legislative Budget Office in September 1984 and continued in this
- 43 important position for over 15 years until his retirement on
- 44 January 31, 2000; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee prepared two biennial and 15 annual
- 46 state budget recommendations for the Commission of Budget and
- 47 Accounting and prepared 16 annual state budget recommendations for
- 48 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee has observed during his career with
- 50 the Legislature the State General Fund budget recommendation
- 51 increase from \$254 million for fiscal biennium 1962-1964 to \$3.6
- 52 billion for fiscal year 2000; and
- 53 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee was married to his wife, Mary Jane
- 54 Wilder, of Greenwood on August 29, 1959; and
- 55 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee and his wife, Mary Jane, are the
- 56 proud parents of three children, Susan Greenlee South of Spring,
- 57 Texas, Charles Wilder Greenlee of Ridgeland, Mississippi, and
- 58 Robert Michael Greenlee who died in 1984; and three grandchildren,
- 59 James Robert South, Amy Elise South and Charles Wilder Greenlee,
- 60 II; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee is a member of Port Gibson United
- 62 Methodist Church where he serves as a teacher for an adult Sunday
- 63 School class; and
- 64 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee served for six years in the
- 65 Mississippi Air National Guard from 1959 to 1965 as an Airman

- 66 First Class, and
- 67 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee has served as a member of the Board
- 68 of Directors of the Mississippi Southern Bank of Port Gibson since
- 69 1988 and is a member of the bank's finance committee; and
- 70 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee is a member of the National
- 71 Association of State Budget Officers, which bestowed upon him in
- 72 May 1999 an honorary membership in recognition of his
- 73 contributions to state budgeting and in appreciation for his
- 74 service to the association; and
- 75 WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee has been instrumental in the
- 76 development of important measures to strengthen the state budget
- 77 process, including the Budget Reform Act of 1992 which limited
- 78 appropriations to 98% of available funds and which created the
- 79 General Fund Stabilization Reserve that today has a balance of
- 80 over \$235 million; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Greenlee has been an exceptionally qualified
- 82 and dedicated public servant who has devoted 39 years of his life
- 83 in service to the Legislature and the State of Mississippi and has
- 84 provided sound advice and counsel to legislators and state
- 85 agencies and institutions throughout this period:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 87 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 88 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend Robert A. Greenlee for his
- 89 outstanding service to the Legislature of the State of
- 90 Mississippi.
