HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 88
(As Adopted by House)

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE MISSISSIPPI YOUNG MEN
2 AND YOUNG WOMEN UPON THEIR GRADUATION AS THE CLASS OF 2000 FROM
3 THE UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY AT WEST POINT, THE UNITED
4 STATES NAVAL ACADEMY AND THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY.

5 WHEREAS, these young Mississippians, along with other young
6 women and men from all over the United States, will be graduating
7 after four years of intense military, academic and physical
8 fitness training; and

9 WHEREAS, the Class of 2000 graduates have met the
10 requirements of a curriculum designed to develop character,
11 discipline and other qualities necessary to become military
12 leaders for our country; and

13 WHEREAS, as military officers, these graduates are making a
14 commitment to live under the Military Honor Code, defend the
15 United States Constitution and put their lives in harm's way if
16 needed to defend the United States of America; and

17 WHEREAS, the graduates from the United States Military
