1 2 3	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO INSTALL A TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE ON HIGHWAY 19 SOUTH.
4	WHEREAS, traffic traveling on Highway 19 South at the
5	entrances of Southeast Middle School and the Southeast Attendance

- 6 Center are extremely congested during the morning and afternoon
- 7 school hours; and
- 8 WHEREAS, these entrances onto Highway 19 South are so
- 9 dangerous and hazardous to the public welfare and safety of the
- 10 citizens of Mississippi that a law enforcement officer is required
- 11 to direct traffic at these locations; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the installation of a traffic control device would
- 13 greatly enhance the safety of citizens traveling Highway 19 South,
- 14 especially near the Southeast Middle School and Southeast
- 15 Attendance Center entrances; and
- 16 WHEREAS, the Legislature believes that the promotion of the
- 17 health and safety of Mississippi citizens is a serious
- 18 responsibility to be shared by all branches of government; and
- 19 WHEREAS, under the authority provided in Section 63-3-303 of
- 20 the Mississippi Code of 1972, the Department of Transportation and
- 21 the Commissioner of Public Safety may approve and locate a traffic
- 22 light, or other traffic control device on Highway 19 South at the
- 23 Southeast School entrance:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 25 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 26 THEREIN, That we do hereby memorialize the Mississippi Department

- 27 of Transportation to install a traffic light, or other traffic
- 28 control device on Highway 19 South at the entrances of Southeast
- 29 Middle School and the Southeast Attendance Center.
- 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
- 31 furnished to the Mississippi Department of Transportation, the
- 32 Board of Supervisors of Lauderdale County and to the members of
- 33 the Capitol Press Corps.
