1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 73-65-1 THROUGH 73-65-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH ARE THE PROFESSIONAL ART THERAPISTS REGULATORY LAW; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTIONS 73-65-1 THROUGH 73-65-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CHANGE REFERENCES IN THE PROFESSIONAL ART THERAPISTS REGULATORY LAW FROM "CERTIFICATE" TO "LICENSE"; TO AMEND SECTION 73-65-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE REPEALER ON THE PROFESSIONAL ART THERAPISTS CERTIFICATION LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
10	SECTION 1. Section 73-65-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
11	reenacted and amended as follows:[JU1]
12	73-65-1. As used in this chapter, unless the context
13	otherwise requires:
14	(a) "Board" means the State Board of Health;
15	(b) "Licensed professional art therapist" means a
16	person who has completed a master's or doctoral degree program in
17	art therapy, or an equivalent course of study, from an accredited
18	educational institution and who is <u>licensed</u> by the <u>State Board of</u>
19	<u>Health</u> , or who received registration from the American Art Therapy
20	Association (ATR) before 1980;
21	(c) " <u>License</u> holder" means a <u>licensed</u> professional art
22	therapist <u>licensed</u> under the provisions of this chapter;
23	(d) "Accredited institution" means a university or
24	college accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency

SECTION 2. Section 73-65-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

73-65-3. (1) There is created the Professional Art

reenacted and amended as follows:[JU2]

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- 30 Therapists Advisory Council. The purpose of the council is to advise the State Board of Health on matters relating to the 31 32 administration and interpretation of the provisions of this chapter. The council shall consist of three (3) members who are 33 34 professional art therapists <u>licensed</u> pursuant to Section 73-65-7 35 and who have engaged in art therapy practice for at least five (5) 36 years and two (2) members shall be family members of consumers of art therapy services. All council members shall be citizens of 37 38 the United States and residents of Mississippi. The initial 39 council members who are not family members of consumers shall meet requirements for <u>licensure</u> and be <u>licensed</u> within one (1) year 40 41 after July 1, 2000. Beginning July 1, 2000, each council member 42 who is not a family member of a consumer shall be <u>licensed</u> as an art therapist before appointment and shall be actively engaged in 43 the practicing or teaching of art therapy. The initial council 44 45 members shall be appointed by the board for the following terms: 46 one (1) member shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year; one (1) member shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years; two (2) 47 48 members shall be appointed for terms of three (3) years; and one (1) member shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years. After 49 50 the expiration of the initial terms, all subsequent members of the
- (2) Members of the council shall receive no compensation or per diem for their service on the council, but may receive reimbursement for travel expenses incurred in attending council meetings, as provided in Section 25-3-41.

- 66 (a) Promulgate regulations necessary to carry out the

- (b) Require that all applicants register for, take and

- 72 (c) Establish the application deadline for and score
- 73 required to pass the examination;
- 74 (d) Process applications and conduct and review the
- 75 required examinations;
- 76 (e) Issue <u>licenses</u> to applicants who meet the
- 77 requirements of Sections 73-65-7 through 73-65-13;
- 78 (f) Deny, suspend, or revoke a <u>license</u> to practice art

- 80 (g) Censure, reprimand, or place a <u>license</u> holder or
- 81 applicant on probation for a period not to exceed one (1) year;
- 82 (h) Maintain a current register of <u>license</u> holders as a

- (j) Establish procedures for receiving, investigating,
- 86 and resolving complaints against <u>license</u> holders;
- (k) Approve the level of supervision and experience
- 88 required for persons seeking <u>licensure</u>;
- 89 (1) Assess fees for the issuance and renewal of
- 90 <u>licenses</u> to cover expenses of the board in administering this

- 92 (m) Implement an impaired professional art therapist
- 93 treatment program; and
- 94 (n) Adopt a code of ethics as established by the
- 95 American Art Therapy Association.

96 SECTION 4. Section 73-65-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

97 reenacted and amended as follows:[JU4]

73-65-7. (1) The board shall issue a <u>license</u> as a <u>licensed</u>
99 professional art therapist to any person who files a completed
100 application, accompanied by the required fees, and who submits
101 satisfactory evidence that the applicant is at least twenty-one
102 (21) years of age, demonstrates professional competency by
103 satisfactorily passing the required examination, is a registered
104 art therapist as defined by the Art Therapy Credentials Board,
105 Inc., is a licensed art therapist as defined by the Art Therapy

105 Inc., is a <u>licensed</u> art therapist as defined by the Art Therapy 106 Credentials Board, Inc., and has:

(a) Received a master's degree or doctoral degree in
art therapy that includes six hundred (600) hours of supervised
internship experience from an accredited institution and has
completed an additional one thousand (1,000) client contact hours
of postgraduate experience under appropriate supervision; or

- (b) Received a master's degree or doctoral degree in a related field, has a minimum of twenty-one (21) semester hours of sequential course work in the history, theory, and practice of art therapy, has completed seven hundred (700) hours of supervised internship experience from an accredited institution, and has completed an additional two thousand (2,000) client contact hours of postgraduate experience under appropriate supervision.
- 119 (2) The board may approve on a case-by-case basis applicants 120 who have a master's degree or a doctoral degree from nonaccredited 121 institutions.
- 122 (3) If an applicant has met all of the requirements for

 123 <u>licensure</u> except satisfactorily passing the required examination,

 124 the applicant shall be scheduled to take the next examination

 125 following the approval of the examination.
- (4) An applicant for <u>licensure</u> as a professional art
 therapist may be <u>licensed</u> without examination if the applicant
 files a completed application within one (1) year of July 1, 1998,

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- 129 accompanied by the required fees, and if the board determines that
- 130 the applicant meets all other requirements for <u>licensure</u> as a
- 131 professional art therapist.
- 132 (5) The board may issue a <u>license</u> to an applicant without
- 133 examination if the person possesses a valid regulatory document
- 134 issued by the appropriate examining board under the laws of any
- 135 other state or territory of the United States, the District of
- 136 Columbia, or any foreign nation that in the judgment of the board
- 137 has requirements substantially equivalent to or exceeding the
- 138 requirements in this section.
- 139 (6) The board may issue provisional <u>licensure</u> as a
- 140 professional art therapist to any person who has completed the
- 141 educational requirements in subsection (1)(a) or (1)(b) of this
- 142 section and is fulfilling the client contact hours requirement,
- 143 but has not taken the examination or received registration from
- 144 the American Art Therapy Association (ATR).
- 145 (7) The board may set criteria for continuing education and
- 146 supervisory experience.
- SECTION 5. Section 73-65-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 148 reenacted and amended as follows:[JU5]
- 149 73-65-9. (1) Each <u>license</u> holder shall renew the <u>license</u> to
- 150 practice art therapy biennially by submitting a renewal
- 151 application on a form provided by the board, paying a <u>license</u>
- 152 renewal fee, and producing evidence of completion of relevant
- 153 professional continuing education experience satisfactory to the
- 154 board, not to exceed forty (40) hours per renewal cycle.
- 155 (2) A ninety-day grace period shall be allowed for each
- 156 <u>license</u> holder after the <u>licensure</u> period, during which time the
- 157 <u>license</u> may be renewed upon payment of the renewal fee, the late
- 158 fee, and compliance with all renewal requirements.
- 159 (3) Any <u>license</u> granted by the board shall be automatically
- 160 suspended if the holder fails to apply for the <u>license</u> renewal
- 161 pursuant to this section within a period of three (3) months after

- 162 the renewal deadline; however, any suspended <u>license</u> may be
- 163 restored by the board upon payment of a reinstatement fee not to
- 164 exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in addition to any unpaid
- 165 renewal or late fees. Failure to renew a <u>license</u> within three (3)
- 166 months from the date of suspension as provided in this section
- 167 shall cause the <u>license</u> to be automatically revoked.
- 168 Reinstatement of a revoked <u>license</u> shall require the <u>license</u>
- 169 holder to reapply and meet all current standards for <u>licensure</u>.
- 170 (4) A person <u>licensed</u> under the provisions of Section
- 171 73-65-7 who intends to retire as a <u>licensed</u> professional art
- 172 therapist shall notify the board in writing before the expiration
- 173 of his current <u>licensure</u>. If, within a period of five (5) years
- 174 from the year of retirement, the <u>license</u> holder wishes to resume
- 175 practice as a <u>licensed</u> professional art therapist, he shall notify
- 176 the board in writing, and upon giving proof of completing the
- 177 required continuing education and the payment of an amount
- 178 equivalent to elapsed renewal fees, the <u>license</u> shall be restored
- 179 in full effect.
- SECTION 6. Section 73-65-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 181 reenacted and amended as follows:[JU6]
- 182 73-65-11. The board shall set the amount of the fees
- 183 required to be paid by applicants for <u>licensure</u> and <u>license</u>
- 184 holders including, but not limited to, the following:
- 185 (a) For an application for initial <u>licensure</u>, the fee
- 186 shall be nonrefundable and shall not exceed Two Hundred Dollars
- 187 (\$200.00);
- 188 (b) The renewal fee shall not exceed Two Hundred
- 189 Dollars (\$200.00);
- 190 (c) For a duplicate or replacement <u>license</u>, the fee
- 191 shall not exceed Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00);
- 192 (d) For failure to renew a <u>license</u> within the allotted
- 193 grace period pursuant to Section 73-65-9, the fee shall not exceed
- 194 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00); and

- (e) Other reasonable fees for administrative services.
- 196 SECTION 7. Section 73-65-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 197 reenacted and amended as follows:[JU7]
- 198 73-65-13. (1) The board may deny any application, or
- 199 suspend or revoke any <u>license</u> held or applied for under the
- 200 provisions of Section 73-65-7 if the person:
- 201 (a) Is found guilty of fraud, deceit, or
- 202 misrepresentation in procuring or attempting to procure a <u>license</u>
- 203 to practice art therapy;
- 204 (b) Is adjudicated mentally incompetent;
- 205 (c) Is found guilty of a felony or misdemeanor
- 206 involving moral turpitude;
- 207 (d) Is found guilty of unprofessional or unethical
- 208 conduct in this or any other jurisdiction;
- 209 (e) Has been using any controlled substance or
- 210 alcoholic beverage to an extent or in a manner dangerous to the
- 211 person, any other person, or the public, or to an extent that the
- 212 use impairs the ability to perform as a <u>licensed</u> professional art
- 213 therapist;
- 214 (f) Has violated any provision of this chapter; or
- 215 (g) Willfully or negligently divulges a professional
- 216 confidence.
- 217 (2) A certified copy of the record of conviction shall be
- 218 conclusive evidence of the conviction.
- 219 (3) Disciplinary proceedings may be initiated upon the
- 220 receipt by the board of a sworn complaint by any person, including
- 221 members of the board.
- SECTION 8. Section 73-65-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 223 reenacted and amended as follows:[JU8]
- 73-65-15. (1) The provisions of this chapter shall not
- 225 apply to persons licensed, certified, or registered under any
- 226 other provisions of Mississippi law, including, but not limited
- 227 to, physicians, social workers, psychologists, and nurses, or

- 228 students within accredited training programs of these professions.
- 229 The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to "activities
- 230 professionals" at licensed nursing facilities. Nothing in this
- 231 chapter shall be construed to limit, interfere with, or restrict
- 232 the practice, descriptions of services, or manner in which these
- 233 persons hold themselves out to the public.
- 234 (2) No person shall use the title "licensed professional art
- 235 therapist" or hold himself out as having this status, unless he is
- 236 <u>licensed</u> as such by the board.
- SECTION 9. Section 73-65-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 238 reenacted as follows:[JU9]
- 73-65-17. Any person who violates the provisions of this
- 240 chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
- 241 thereof, shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars
- 242 (\$500.00), or sentenced to three (3) months in the county jail, or
- 243 both, for each violation.
- SECTION 10. Section 73-65-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 245 amended as follows:
- 246 73-65-19. Sections 73-65-1 through 73-65-17 shall stand
- 247 repealed on July 1, 2002.
- 248 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 249 and after June 30, 2000.
