SENATE BILL NO. 2086

AN ACT TO PROVIDE CERTAIN CONDITIONS ON THE EMPLOYMENT OF 1 2 SCHOOL GUIDANCE COUNSELORS BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS, AND TO PRESCRIBE 3 THE COMPREHENSIVE COUNSELING SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY SUCH 4 COUNSELORS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. (1) The assignment of guidance counselors to the particular schools within the school district shall be at the 7 discretion of the local school board with the following 8 restrictions: 9 The counselor/student ratio shall be no greater 10 (a) than 1/300 to implement a standards-based, comprehensive school 11 12 counseling program. (b) No individual shall be employed as a school 13 guidance counselor without appropriate training and certification 14 as determined by the State Department of Education. 15 (c) School guidance counselors shall be full-time 16 professional personnel, shall spend at least seventy-five percent 17 (75%) of work time in direct counseling contact with students, and 18 19 shall devote no more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the work day to administrative activities relating to counseling services. 20 21 (d) School guidance counselors shall provide the following comprehensive counseling services: 22

(i) Individual student academic program planning; 23 Interpreting cognitive, aptitude and 24 (ii) achievement tests; 25 (iii) Counseling students who are tardy or absent; 26 (iv) Collaborating with teachers to present 27 28 guidance curriculum lessons; (v)Counseling students who have disciplinary 29 30 problems; (vi) Counseling students as to appropriate school 31 dress; 32 33 (vii) Analyzing grade-point averages in relationship to achievement; 34 Interpreting student records; 35 (viii) (ix) Providing teachers with suggestions for 36 better management of study halls; 37 38 (x) Ensuring that student records are maintained as per state and federal regulations; 39 (xi) Assisting the school principal with 40 identifying and resolving student issues, needs and problems; 41 (xii) Career and educational planning and 42 placement; 43 (xiii) Preventive classroom counseling activities 44 45 and crisis intervention; and Written communication to parents or 46 (xiv) guardians of students following student counseling. 47 School guidance counselors shall not be required to 48 (e) provide the following services: 49 (i) Registration and scheduling of new students; 50 (ii) Administering cognitive, aptitude and 51 52 achievement tests; Responsibility for signing excuses for 53 (iii)

(iv) Teaching classes when teachers are absent; 55 56 (v) Performing disciplinary actions; (vi) Sending students home who are not 57 appropriately dressed; 58 (vii) Computing grade-point averages for students; 59 (viii) Maintaining student records and other 60 61 clerical record keeping; (vix) Supervising study halls; and 62 (x) Assisting with duties in the principal's 63 office. 64 The State Department of Education may adopt regulations 65 (2) regarding the activities of the school guidance counselor as are 66 not inconsistent with this section. 67 68 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2000. 69
