SENATE BILL NO. 2246

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56.2, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF A DISTINCTIVE MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE 3 TAG TO RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56.2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:[CRG1] 6 7 27-19-56.2. (1) Any owner of a motor vehicle who is a duly sworn law enforcement officer employed by or in the service of the 8 9 state, a county, a municipality or other political subdivision of 10 the state, or who is a retired law enforcement officer who is a 11 resident of this state, upon payment of the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes and registration fees as 12 prescribed by law for private carriers of passengers, pickup 13 trucks and other noncommercial motor vehicles, and upon payment of 14 15 an additional fee in the amount provided in subsection (3) of this 16 section, shall be issued a distinctive license tag for each motor 17 vehicle registered in his name identifying such person as a law enforcement officer or retired law enforcement officer. 18 distinctive license tags so issued shall be of such color and 19 20 design as may be agreed upon by the Executive Committee of the

Mississippi Law Enforcement Officer's Association, the Legislative

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22 Committee of the Mississippi Sheriff's Association, the Executive

23 Board of the Police Chiefs Association and the State Tax

24 Commission. The State Tax Commission shall have final approval of

25 the color and design. Each such distinctive license tag shall

26 consist of such letters or numbers, or both, as may be necessary

27 to distinguish each license tag and may, in the discretion of the

28 State Tax Commission, display the county name.

29 (2) Application for the distinctive license tags authorized

30 by this section shall be made to the county tax collector on forms

31 prescribed by the State Tax Commission. Applicants for such

32 distinctive license tags (a) shall present to the issuing official

proof of their employment or service as a law enforcement officer

34 by presentation of the applicant's official law enforcement

35 officer's identification card or a signed and notarized affidavit

36 from the governing authority or chief executive officer of the

37 agency, county, municipality or political subdivision by or for

38 whom the applicant is employed or serves as a law enforcement

39 officer, or (b) shall present proof that they are a retired law

40 <u>enforcement officer by presentation of a signed and notarized</u>

41 <u>affidavit from the governing authority or chief executive officer</u>

42 of the agency, county, municipality or political subdivision from

whom the law enforcement officer retired. The application and the

44 additional fee imposed under subsection (3) of this section, less

45 three percent (3%) thereof to be retained by the tax collector,

46 shall be remitted to the State Tax Commission on a monthly basis

47 as prescribed by the commission. The portion of the additional

48 fee retained by the tax collector shall be deposited into the

49 county general fund.

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50 (3) Beginning with any registration year commencing on or

51 after July 1, 1992, any person applying for a distinctive license

52 tag under this section shall pay an additional fee in the amount

of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each distinctive license tag applied

54 for under this section which shall be in addition to all other

55 taxes and fees. The additional fee paid shall be for a period of

56 time to run concurrent with the vehicle's established license tag

57 year. The additional fee is due and payable at the time the

58 original application is made for a distinctive license tag under

59 this section and thereafter annually at the time of renewal

60 registration as long as the owner retains the distinctive license

61 tag. If the owner does not wish to retain the distinctive license

tag, or if the owner retires or resigns from or otherwise vacates

63 his employment or service as a law enforcement officer, he must

64 surrender it to the local county tax collector.

65 (4) The State Tax Commission shall deposit all fees into the

66 State Treasury on the day collected. At the end of each month,

67 the State Tax Commission shall certify to the State Treasurer the

68 total fees collected under this section from the issuance of

69 distinctive license tags. The State Treasurer shall distribute an

70 amount equal to Seven Dollars (\$7.00) of the additional fees

71 collected for each such distinctive license tag issued under this

72 section to the State General Fund, and the remainder of such

73 additional fees collected shall be distributed by the State

74 Treasurer to the credit of the special fund created in Section

75 7-9-70.

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76 (5) A regular license tag must be properly displayed as

77 required by law until replaced by a distinctive license tag under

78 this section. The regular license tag must be surrendered to the

79 tax collector upon issuance of the distinctive license tag under

80 this section. The tax collector shall issue up to two (2) license

- 81 decals for each distinctive license tag issued under this section,
- 82 which will expire the same month and year as the regular license
- 83 tag.
- 84 (6) In the case of loss or theft of a distinctive license
- 85 tag issued under this section, the owner may make application and
- 86 affidavit for a replacement distinctive license tag as provided by
- 87 Section 27-19-37, Mississippi Code of 1972. The fee for a
- 88 replacement distinctive license tag shall be Ten Dollars (\$10.00).
- 89 The tax collector receiving such application and affidavit shall
- 90 be entitled to retain and deposit into the county general fund
- 91 five percent (5%) of the fee for such replacement license tag and
- 92 the remainder shall be distributed in the same manner as funds
- 93 from the sale of regular distinctive license tags issued under
- 94 this section.
- 95 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 96 and after July 1, 2000.
