SENATE BILL NO. 2283

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- 2 INCREASE THE FEE PAID FOR THE REINSTATEMENT OF A MISSISSIPPI
- 3 DRIVER'S LICENSE SUBSEQUENT TO SUSPENSION, REVOCATION OR
- 4 CANCELLATION DUE TO DUI OR DRUG OFFENSE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 63-1-46, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 63-1-46. (1) A fee of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) shall be
- 9 charged for the reinstatement of a license issued pursuant to this
- 10 article to every person whose license has been validly suspended,
- 11 revoked or cancelled. This fee shall be in addition to the fee
- 12 provided for in Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 13 (2) The funds received under the provisions of subsection
- 14 (1) of this section shall be deposited into the State General Fund
- in accordance with Section 45-1-23, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 16 (3) In addition to the fee provided for in subsection (1) of
- 17 this section, an additional fee of One Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars
- 18 (\$125.00) shall be charged for the reinstatement of a license
- 19 issued pursuant to this article to every person whose license has
- 20 been suspended or revoked under the provisions of the Mississippi
- 21 Implied Consent Law or as a result of a conviction of a violation
- 22 of the Uniform Controlled Substances Law under the provisions of

- 23 Section 63-1-71.
- 24 (4) The funds received under the provisions of subsection
- 25 (3) of this section shall be placed in a special fund hereby
- 26 created in the State Treasury. Monies in such special fund may be
- 27 expended solely to contribute to the Disability and Relief Fund
- 28 for members of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol such amounts
- 29 as are necessary to make sworn agents of the Mississippi Bureau of
- 30 Narcotics who were employed by such bureau prior to December 1,
- 31 1990, and who were subsequently employed as enforcement troopers
- 32 by the Department of Public Safety, full members of the retirement
- 33 system for the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol with full credit
- 34 for the time they were employed as sworn agents for the
- 35 Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics. The Board of Trustees of the
- 36 Public Employees' Retirement System shall certify to the State
- 37 Treasurer the amounts necessary for the purposes described above.
- 38 The State Treasurer shall monthly transfer from the special fund
- 39 created pursuant to this subsection the amounts deposited in such
- 40 special fund to the Disability and Relief Fund for members of the
- 41 Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol until such time as the certified
- 42 amount has been transferred. At such time as the certified amount
- 43 has been transferred, the State Treasurer shall transfer any funds
- 44 remaining in the special fund created pursuant to this subsection
- 45 to the State General Fund and shall then dissolve such special
- 46 fund. This subsection (4) of Section 63-1-46 shall stand repealed
- 47 at such time when the State Treasurer transfers funds and
- 48 dissolves the special fund account in accordance with the
- 49 provisions of this subsection.
- 50 (5) The procedure for the reinstatement of a license issued
- 51 pursuant to this article that has been suspended for being out of
- 52 compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section
- 53 93-11-153, and the payment of any fees for the reinstatement of a

- 54 license suspended for that purpose, shall be governed by Section
- 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 57 and after July 1, 2000.
